Sample ballots and information pamphlets are on the way for the May 2nd City of Lake Elsinore Special Measure Election

Approximately 25,000 sample ballots and information pamphlets started going out to City of Lake Elsinore voters today (March 27th) for the special measure election on May 2nd. The initial sample ballot mailing process will be complete by April 3rd.

Material in the pamphlet will help voters make informed choices. Voters may mark their selections on the sample ballot and use it as a guide to help them complete their official ballot at the polls. The Registrar of Voters recommends that voters review the materials before casting an official ballot. If voters do not receive an informational guide in the mail, it will be available online at www.lake-elsinore.org and www.voteinfo.net on March 27th. Voters also may call the Registrar's office at (951) 486-7200 or (800) 773-8683 to request a mailed copy.

Registered voters in the City of Lake Elsinore are eligible to cast votes in the May 2nd election. For questions about your eligibility to vote, please contact the Registrar's office at (951) 486-7200.

Voter polling-place locations are printed on the back cover of the information pamphlet, which includes an application to request a vote-by-mail ballot. A Spanish-language version of the pamphlet will be available at www.lake-elsinore.org and www.voteinfo.net and a copy can be mailed upon request.

Below is a list of important deadlines for the May 2nd election:

- **April 3** First day of early voting in the Registrar of Voters' office and first day the registrar is allowed to mail vote-by-mail ballots to voters.
- April 17 Last day to register to vote for the May 2 election.
- April 25 Last day the registrar may accept mailed requests for vote-by-mail ballots. After April 25th, voters must go to the registrar's office to request and pick up a vote-by-mail ballot. Voters who have requested but not received a vote-by-mail ballot by April 25th should contact the Registrar's office at (951) 486-7200.
- May 2 Election Day

Polling places are open from **7 a.m. to 8 p.m**. on Election Day. <u>Vote-by-mail ballots must be received by elections officials no later than the close of the polls on Election Day or be postmarked on or before Election Day and received no later than three days after Election Day to be counted.</u>

Vote-by-Mail ballots, may be mailed in to the Registrar's office, dropped off at City Hall, dropped off at the Registrar's office or on election day dropped off at any polling location in the City.
