Vote-by-Mail ballots for June 8 election on the way to Riverside voters

Approximately 69,575 vote-by-mail ballots will be mailed to voters in the City of Riverside next week for the June 8 general municipal mail ballot election for the city's Wards 2, 4 and 6 city council seats. Completed ballots must be received at the Registrar of Voters office no later than 8 p.m. on Election Day or be postmarked on or before Election Day and received no later than three days after Election Day to be counted. Because it is solely a mail-ballot election, there will be no established polling places.

Vote-by-mail ballots can be returned through the postal service or deposited in designated vote-by-mail drop-off boxes. Vote-by-mail drop-off locations and hours of operation can be found on the registrar's website at www.voteinfo.net. A 24-hour drop box is available outside the main entrance of the registrar's office at 2720 Gateway Drive in Riverside.

Early voting at the Registrar of Voters office begins Monday, May 10, and continues Monday through Friday, excluding county holidays, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The registrar's office will be open to voters on Election Day from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

The June 8 general municipal mail ballot election is not a countywide election, so some areas of the county are not included in the election. If you have any questions about your eligibility to vote, please contact the registrar's office at (951) 486-7200.

If you want to register, update your address, or change your political party preference, you must complete a voter registration application and submit it by May 24. You can register online

at registertovote.ca.gov or request a paper application by calling (951) 486-7200.

Special Note: Effective Jan. 1, 2017, Conditional Voter Registration (CVR) is available to eligible voters in California pursuant to Election Codes 2170 through 2173. CVR extends the existing 15-day registration deadline to eligible voters, allowing them to register and vote 14 days prior to an election through Election Day.
