## Voters urged to drop off ballots, <u>not</u> use the mail, after Friday

In order to ensure that ballots reach elections officials in time to be counted on Election Day, voters should <u>not</u> return their ballots by mail after Friday (Oct. 29).

After Friday, voters are encouraged to return their ballots to drop-off boxes in city clerks' offices and county libraries through Monday (Nov. 1) or at any polling place in the county on Election Day (Nov. 2). A link to the location of the drop-off boxes is available on the Registrar of Voters website, <u>http://www.voteinfo.net/</u>

Ballots also can be deposited in the 24-hour drop box outside the front entrance to Registrar of Voters office at 2724 Gateway Drive in Riverside.

Ballots must reach the registrar by 8 p.m. on Election Day to be counted. Ballots with postmarks before the deadline are not accepted and <u>cannot</u> be counted if they reach the registrar's office after the 8 p.m. deadline on Tuesday.

As of Wednesday (Oct. 27), more than 405,000 vote-by-mail ballots have been sent to voters and almost 132,000 had been returned. Registrar of Voters Barbara Dunmore on Thursday encouraged every eligible voter to cast a ballot in Tuesday's general election.
