## Ballots for Tuesday's election should be dropped at the registrar's office, <u>not</u> mailed

To ensure that ballots reach election officials in time to be counted in Tuesday's election, voters should not return their ballots by mail after Friday (Nov. 4).

After Friday, voters are encouraged to return their ballots to drop-off boxes in participating city clerks' offices and county libraries through Monday (Nov. 7) or at any polling place in the county on Election Day (Nov. 8). A link to the location of the drop-off boxes is available on the Registrar of Voters website at <a href="https://www.voteinfo.net">www.voteinfo.net</a>. Ballots also can be deposited in the 24-hour drop box outside the front entrance to the Registrar of Voters office at 2724 Gateway Drive in Riverside.

Ballots must reach the registrar by 8 p.m. on Election Day to be counted. Ballots with postmarks before the deadline are not accepted and <u>cannot</u> be counted if they reach the registrar's office after the 8 p.m. deadline on Tuesday.

As of Tuesday (Nov. 1), approximately 125,969 vote-by-mail ballots had been sent to voters and 31,453 had been returned. Registrar of Voters Kari Verjil encourages every eligible voter to cast a ballot in the election.
