Early voting available Saturday at Registrar of Voters' office

For voters in Riverside County who can't make it to the polls on Election Day, or who may have missed the opportunity to vote by mail, early voting might be the answer. Early voting will be available Saturday (Jun. 4) from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Registrar of Voters office, 2724 Gateway Drive in Riverside.

Voters also can vote at the registrar's office from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. today (6/3), and on Monday, and from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Election Day (Jun. 7).

Call the registrar's office at (951) 486-7200 if you have questions about your eligibility to vote.

Registrar of Voters Rebecca Spencer encourages every eligible voter to cast a ballot in the election.

Important information regarding the presidential primary election:

• Your right to vote in the presidential primary depends on your political party registration. If you are registered with a political party, you can only vote for a candidate running for president in that party. A "No Party Preference" voter will automatically receive a non-partisan ballot, that will have no presidential candidates listed. However, upon request, a "No

Party Preference" voter can instead receive a ballot to vote the presidential ballot of the following parties:

- American Independent Party
- Democratic Party
- Libertarian Party

The Green, Peace and Freedom, and Republican parties are not allowing crossover voting in this election.

• There are 34 candidates for U.S. senator on the ballot. Look at your ballot carefully and be sure to cast only one vote for U.S. senator or your vote will not count.
