- ✓ Your voted ballot must be in the possession of the Riverside County Registrar of Voters office by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day or be postmarked on or before Election Day and received no later than three days after Election Day to be counted.
- ✓ You may verify that the Registrar of Voters has received your voted ballot by checking the return status online at <u>www.voteinfo.net.</u>
- ✓ If you have changed your name or moved and have not re-registered at your current residence address, call us for further information at (951) 486-7200 or 1-800-773-8683. State law requires that your signature and current address must match your voter registration on file with our office.

If for some reason you are unable to vote the enclosed official ballot, you may vote at the Registrar of Voters office July 27 – August 24, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.; and Election Day, August 25, 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. You may also call our office at (951) 486-7200 for the nearest accessible drop-off location.

Thank you for your continued participation and support in making democracy work.



POLLING PLACES <u>WILL NOT</u> BE ESTABLISHED FOR THIS ELECTION. The enclosed ballot is your OFFICIAL BALLOT for this election. VOTING INSTRUCTIONS		
Your voted ballot must be in the possession of the Registrar of Voters Office no later than 8:00 p.m. on Election Day or be postmarked on or before Election Day and received no later than three days after Election Day to be counted.		
 Use a black ball point pen. <i>DO NOT</i> use felt tip, red or gel ink. To vote for a candidate whose name appears on the ballot, connect the head and tail of the arrow to the right of the name of the candidate for whom you wish to vote. To vote for a qualified write-in candidate, print the candidate's name in the space provided below the candidates listed for the same office and connect the head and tail of the arrow to the right of the name of the candidate of the head and tail of the arrow to the right of the name of the candidate on the head and tail of the arrow to the right of the name you have written in. (<i>Important!</i> If you do not connect the arrow, your vote will not be counted.) One line connecting the arrow is preferred. Vote for no more than the number of votes allowed in each contest (e.g. vote for one, vote for no more than two, etc.). Remove the top stub and place the voted ballot card in the return envelope provided. Please keep the ballot folded the same way as you received it. Sign your name and print your address where indicated. If you fail to sign the envelope your vote cannot be counted; and b. Seal the envelope. Return your ballot: A postage-paid envelope is provided to conveniently return your ballot by mail. Since this is a mail ballot election, there are no established polling places. Voters residing outside of the territorial limits of the United States must add postage appropriate for their current location.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION		
 UNABLE TO RETURN YOUR BALLOT PERSONALLY? State law allows you to authorize your spouse, parent, child, grandparent, grandchild, brother, sister or a person residing in the same household to return your ballot for you. You and your designated representative must complete the authorization statement on the enclosed return envelope. SPOILED YOUR BALLOT? Place the ballot card in the enclosed return envelope, place a check mark in the spoiled box on the return envelope and return it to our office. A new ballot will be sent to you if there is sufficient time to do so. If there is not sufficient time to return your ballot and receive another by mail, you may return your ballot personally to the Registrar of Voters office or call for further instructions at (951) 486-7200 or 1-800-773-8683. ACCESSIBLE VOTING UNIT. An Accessible Voting Unit is available upon request at the Registrar of Voters office. CLOSE OF REGISTRATION. The last day to register to vote for this election is August 10, 2015. Each candidate's statement is volunteered by the candidate and is printed at the expense of the candidate.  One line connecting the arrow is preferred Vote for no more than the number of votes allowed in each contest (e.g. vote for one, vote for no more than two, etc.) 		
Please keep the ballot folded the same way as you received it		
Vote First, Count First! Vote-by-Mail ballots received before Election Day are counted first. Return your ballot as soon as possible to ensure that it is included in the first Election Night results!
