Please note – this year voting is different! This Voter Information Guide contains information for the November 3, 2020 Consolidated General Election. In an effort to reduce the spread of COVID-19 and in accordance with State Law, the Riverside County Registrar of Voters will be deploying a new election model for the upcoming November 3, 2020 Election. This will offer our voters more ways and more days to vote safely. Each eligible registered voter for the November 3, 2020 Election will receive a ballot by mail beginning Monday, October 5, 2020 in accordance with the Governor's Executive Order.

Voters can verify their voter registration at <u>voterstatus.sos.ca.gov</u> or register to vote at registertovote.ca.gov.

- Your Vote-By-Mail ballot may be returned at any of our 80 secure Ballot Drop-Off locations that will be available beginning October 5, 2020 or via USPS (no postage required).
- We are now operating nearly 130 Voter Assistance Centers throughout Riverside County. You can vote in-person at any location from October 31 – November 3, 2020.
- You may track your ballot by registering at <u>WheresMyBallot.sos.ca.gov</u>.
- A list of all Ballot Drop-Off locations and Voter Assistance Centers is posted at www.voteinfo.net.

The Riverside County Registrar of Voters recommends that voters only use the in-person Voter Assistance Centers if absolutely necessary, as the generalized use of in-person voting presents risks to public health and safety in light of the COVID-19 pandemic. Social distancing will be required when visiting a Voter Assistance Center and face coverings are strongly encouraged.

# Elections in California

The Top Two Candidates Open Primary Act requires that all candidates for a voter-nominated office be listed on the same ballot. Previously known as partisan offices, voter-nominated offices include state legislative offices, U.S. congressional offices, and state constitutional offices.

In both the open primary and general elections, you can vote for any candidate regardless of what party preference you indicated on your voter registration form. In the primary election, the two candidates receiving the most votes—regardless of party preference—move on to the general election. If a candidate receives a majority of the vote (at least 50 percent +1), a general election still must be held.

California's open primary system does not apply to candidates running for U.S. President, county central committees, or local offices.

Write-in candidates for voter-nominated offices can still run in the primary election. However, a write-in candidate can only move on to the general election if the candidate is one of the top two vote-getters in the primary election. Additionally, there is no independent nomination process for a general election.

California law requires the following information to be printed in this guide.

#### Party-Nominated/Partisan Offices

Political parties may formally nominate candidates for party-nominated/partisan offices at the primary election. A nominated candidate will represent that party as its official candidate for the specific office at the general election and the ballot will reflect an official designation. The top vote-getter for each party at the primary election moves on to the general election. Parties also elect officers of county central committees at the primary election.

A voter can only vote in the primary election of the political party he or she has disclosed a preference for upon registering to vote. However, a political party may allow a person who has declined to disclose a party preference to vote in that party's primary election.

#### **Voter-Nominated Offices**

Political parties are not entitled to formally nominate candidates for voter-nominated offices at the primary election. A candidate nominated for a voter-nominated office at the primary election is the nominee of the people and not the official nominee of any party at the general election. A candidate for nomination to a voter-nominated office shall have his or her qualified party preference, or lack of qualified party preference, stated on the ballot, but the party preference designation is selected solely by the candidate and is shown for the information of the voters only. It does not mean the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party designated, or that there is an affiliation between the party and candidate, and no candidate nominated by the voters shall be deemed to be the officially nominated candidate of any political party. In the county voter information guide, parties may list the candidates for voter-nominated offices who have received the party's official endorsement.

Any voter may vote for any candidate for a voter-nominated office, if they meet the other qualifications required to vote for that office. The top two vote-getters at the primary election move on to the general election for the voter-nominated office even if both candidates have specified the same party preference designation. No party is entitled to have a candidate with its party preference designation move on to the general election, unless the candidate is one of the two highest vote-getters at the primary election.

#### Nonpartisan Offices

Political parties are not entitled to nominate candidates for nonpartisan offices at the primary election, and a candidate at the primary election is not the official nominee of any party for the specific office at the general election. A candidate for nomination to a nonpartisan office may not designate his or her party preference, or lack of party preference, on the ballot. The top two vote-getters at the primary election move on to the general election for the nonpartisan office.



#### **MEASURE "Q" - CITY OF RIVERSIDE**

#### Sec. 404.- Vacancies

A vacancy in an elective office, from whatever cause arising, except in the event of a successful recall, shall be filled by appointment by the City Council, such appointee to hold office until the first Tuesday following the next general municipal election and until his successor qualifies. At the next general municipal election following any vacancy, a successor shall be elected to serve for the remainder of any unexpired term.

If a member of the City Council or the Mayor is absent from three consecutive regular meetings of the City Council, unless by permission of the City Council expressed in its official minutes, or is convicted of a crime involving moral turpitude, the office of such person shall become vacant.

Within fourteen days from notice of the vacancy. The City Council shall declare the existence of any vacancy in elected office, from whatever cause arising, except in the event of a successful recall. In the event it shall fail to fill a vacancy by appointment within sixty days after such office shall have been so declared vacant, it shall cause an election to be held forthwith to fill such vacancy.

For vacancies in elected office with no more than one year remaining on the term from declaration of the vacancy, the City Council shall appoint to fill the vacancy for the remaining term within sixty days after such office shall have been declared vacant. In the event the City Council fails to fill such vacancy by appointment within sixty days after such office shall have been declared vacant, the City Council shall cause an election to be held within one hundred twenty days to fill such vacancy.

For vacancies in elected office with more than one year remaining on the term, the City Council shall call a special election for the purpose of filling the vacancy for the remainder of the term. Such special election shall be held within one hundred twenty days after such office shall have been declared vacant.

If in a special election to fill a vacancy for a member of the City Council for any ward, or for the office of Mayor, no candidate receives a majority of the votes cast for the office, the City Council shall immediately upon the determination of that fact, call a special runoff election to be held within ninety days. The two candidates receiving the highest number of votes in the special election to fill the vacancy shall be declared the candidates for the special runoff election.

If for any election called pursuant to this section, there is a local or statewide election scheduled within one hundred eighty days after such office shall have been declared vacant, the City Council shall consolidate the special election with such local or statewide election.

Appointed officials shall not be permitted to reference "incumbent", "member of the City Council", "Mayor", or other designation indicating incumbency in a Statement of Qualifications published in the sample ballot materials at the subsequent election for the same seat.

#### **IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE "Q"**

(Filling City Council and/or Mayoral Vacancy – Charter Section 404)

If approved by a majority of the voters, this Measure would amend the Riverside City Charter to require the City Council to: appoint to fill a vacancy in elected office with up to one year remaining on the term; call a special election to fill a vacancy in elected office with over one year remaining on the term; call a special run-off election when no candidate receives a majority of the votes cast for the vacant office; and prohibit appointed officials from referencing "incumbent", "member of the City Council", or other designation indicating incumbency, in a subsequent election for the same seat.

The Riverside City Charter currently provides that a vacancy in an elected office, from whatever cause arising, except in the event of a successful recall, shall be filled by appointment by the City Council, such appointee to hold office until the first Tuesday following the next general municipal election and until his successor qualifies. The Riverside City Charter currently provides that if the City Council fails to fill a vacancy by appointment within 60 days after the office is declared vacant, then the City Council must cause an election to be held. The Riverside City Charter currently does not prohibit appointed officials from referencing "incumbent", "member of the City Council", or other designation indicating incumbency, in a subsequent election for the same seat.

If this Measure is approved, the fiscal impact would be the cost of calling each special election, which is currently estimated to be \$63,000.

This Measure is being placed on this ballot by the City Council of the City of Riverside, acting upon the recommendation of the Riverside Charter Review Committee.

This Impartial Analysis is hereby submitted to the Elections Official in conformance with Section 9280 of the Elections Code of the State of California. This Measure does not result in any new City powers.

#### ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE "Q"

Election of representative leadership is the cornerstone of American Democracy. In the event of a vacancy on the City Council with more than one year remaining in the term, Measure Q will ensure that the individual who fills that seat is voted in by the people and not appointed by local politicians.

As Riverside consolidates odd-numbered year elections with evennumbered year elections, residents will be voting every two years. As it stands, if a seat becomes vacant with two years left before the term expires, the City Council appoints a replacement to serve the remainder of the term. This is an excessive amount of allowable time for a nonelected person to represent the citizens of Riverside.

Decisions made at the local level often have the largest and most immediate impact on the daily lives of residents. From tackling our housing crisis to charting a path of recovery from the COVID-19 crisis, City leaders will play a fundamental role in shaping the future of Riverside. It is critical that these officials be vetted and elected by the people of Riverside – not appointed by their future political peers.

Measure Q is necessary to preserve our fundamental right to elect leadership. This amendment balances the right to elected leadership with the expense of elections. Any vacancy with less than a year remaining on the term will be appointed which can often spare the cost of a special election. However, any vacancy with more than a year remaining will be filled through an election.

Passing Measure Q will help assure that our local leadership truly represents the priorities and values of the electorate. We strongly encourage a "yes" vote on Measure Q.

#### **MEASURE "R" - CITY OF RIVERSIDE**

#### Sec. 400. Enumerated; number, term and manner of election; wards.

- (a) The elective officers of the City shall consist of a City Council of seven members, elected from wards, and a Mayor elected from the City at large, at the times and in the manner provided in this Charter, who shall serve for a term of four years and until their respective successors qualify. The terms of all officials, so elected, shall be deemed to have commenced on the fifth Tuesday following the general municipal election.
- (b) The members of the City Council shall be <u>nominated and</u> elected by wards by the registered voters of the respective wards only. One member of the City Council shall be elected by each ward, and only the registered voters of each ward shall vote for the member of the City Council to be elected by that ward. In those wards where there are more than two candidates, only a candidate receiving a majority of the total votes cast for the office shall be declared elected.
- (c) If in an election for a member of the City Council for any ward, or for the office of Mayor, no candidate receives a majority of the total votes cast for the office, the City Council shall immediately upon the determination of that fact, call a special election to be held on the first Tuesday following the first Monday of November of that same year same day as the statewide election of that same year, consistent with the general election date set by the State. The two candidates receiving the highest number of votes for the office in the general municipal election shall be declared the candidates for the special election.
- (d) Notwithstanding the paragraph above, if in the June 8, 2021, election for members of the City Council for Wards 2, 4, and 6, no candidate receives a majority of the total votes cast for the office, the City Council shall immediately upon the determination of that fact, call a special election to be held on November 2, 2021. The two candidates receiving the highest number of votes for the office in the June 8, 2021, election shall be declared the candidates for the special election.
- (de) Officials elected at the general municipal election shall take office on the second Tuesday following completion of the canvass, but in no event later than the fifth Tuesday following the general municipal election. Officials elected at any other election shall take office on the second Tuesday following completion of the canvass, but in no event later than the fifth Tuesday following the election.
- (ef) The qualifications of candidates and electors and the procedure governing general municipal elections shall apply to any special election called pursuant to this section and the notice of election shall be published at least thirty days prior to the date of such special election.
- (f) Notwithstanding the above, an election shall be held on June 5, 2007, for the purpose of electing members of the City Council from Wards 1, 3, 5, and 7 for terms expiring in June 2011, or until their successors are elected and seated.
- (g) Notwithstanding the above, an election shall be held on June 2, 2009, for the purpose of electing members of the City Council from Wards 2, 4, and 6 for terms expiring June 2013, or until their successors are elected and seated.
- (h) Notwithstanding the above, an election shall be held on November 3, 2009, for the purpose of electing the Mayor for a term expiring June 2012 or until their successor is elected and seated.

#### Sec. 500. General municipal elections.

On June 8, 2021, an election for Councilmembers to represent Wards 2, 4 and 6 shall be held. Said term shall be for five (5) years and until their respective successors qualify. Beginning in 2026 and thereafter, the Councilmembers' terms shall be for four (4) years.

Beginning in 2022, Ggeneral municipal elections for the election of the members of the City Council and for such other purposes as the City Council may prescribe shall be held in the City on the first Tuesday following the first Monday in June of each odd-numbered year same day as the statewide election, consistent with the primary election date set by the State.

Beginning in 2012, gGeneral municipal elections for the election of the Mayor shall be held on the first Tuesday following the first Monday in June the same day as the statewide election, consistent with the primary election date set by the State in United States Presidential election years.

#### **IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE "R"**

(Setting City election dates to coincide with statewide primary and general elections – Charter Sections 400 & 500)

If approved by a majority of the voters, this Measure would amend the Riverside City Charter to: set municipal election dates to coincide with statewide primary and general elections beginning in 2022; reaffirm that nomination of City Council candidates shall be by voters in their respective Ward; and remove obsolete sections.

Currently, the Riverside City Charter provides that general municipal elections for members of the City Council and for other purposes as the City Council may prescribe are to be held on the first Tuesday following the first Monday in June of each odd-numbered year. Furthermore, the Riverside City Charter currently provides that a special run-off election for all elected office be held on the first Tuesday following the first Monday of November of the same year.

This Measure would amend the Riverside City Charter so that, beginning in 2022, general municipal elections for members of the City Council and for other purposes as the City Council may prescribe are held on the same day as the statewide election, consistent with the primary election date set by the State. Furthermore, this Measure would require a June 8, 2021 election for Councilmembers to represent Wards 2, 4, and 6, for five-year terms until 2026, in order to coincide with the statewide election date. Beginning in 2026 and thereafter, all Councilmembers' terms would revert to four years. In addition, this Measure would amend the Riverside City Charter to require that a special run-off election for all elected office be held on the same days as the statewide election of the same year, consistent with the general election date set by the State. This Measure would create one exception for the June 8, 2021 election, which shall hold a special run-off election, if necessary, on November 2, 2021.

Currently, the Riverside City Charter provides that general municipal elections for Mayor are to be held on the first Tuesday following the first Monday in June of United States Presidential election years.

This Measure would amend the Riverside City Charter so that general municipal elections for Mayor are held the same day as the statewide election, consistent with the primary election date set by the State, in United States Presidential election years.

This Measure would add the words "nominated and" to Section 400(b) of the Riverside City Charter, so that 400(b) would read: "The members of the City Council shall be <u>nominated and</u> elected by wards by the registered voters of the respective wards only." (Emphasis added). This change would reflect current practice. Finally, this Measure would remove Sections 400(f), 400(g), and 400(h), as obsolete.

This Measure is being placed on this ballot by the City Council of the City of Riverside, acting upon the recommendation of the Riverside Charter Review Committee.

Sec. 1404. – Charter, amending.
This Charter, and any of its provisions, may be amended in accordance with the Constitution and laws of the State of California. <u>The City Council must submit any proposed Charter amendment, except for those proposed by voter initiative, to a Charter Review Committee for recommendation before the City Council places the Charter amendment proposal on a ballot.</u>

#### **IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE "S"**

(Requiring the City Council to submit proposed City Charter amendments to a Charter Review Committee - Charter Section 1404)

If approved by a majority of the voters, this Measure would amend the Riverside City Charter to require the City Council to submit any proposed amendment to the Riverside City Charter, except those amendments proposed by voter initiative, to a Charter Review Committee for recommendation before the City Council can place the proposed amendment on a ballot.

The Riverside City Charter currently provides that in February 2019, and in February every eight years thereafter, the City Council shall appoint and appropriate adequate funds for a Charter Review Committee. The Charter Review Committee is comprised of Riverside residents appointed by the Mayor and City Council. The Charter Review Committee has the power and duty to recommend City Charter amendments to the City Council. The City Council may appoint Charter Review Committees more often than every eight years if it desires. However, the Riverside City Charter currently does not require the City Council to first submit a proposed City Charter amendments to a Charter Review Committee for recommendation. Currently, the City Council may directly place a proposed City Charter amendment on the ballot.

If this Measure is approved, it is anticipated to have a minimal fiscal impact upon the City of Riverside. Resources to support Charter Review Committee meetings are estimated to be minimal and anticipated to be absorbed within City Department budgets.

This Measure is being placed on this ballot by the City Council of the City of Riverside, acting upon the recommendation of the Riverside Charter Review Committee.

#### **ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE "S"**

Section 1403 of the City Charter ensures that changes to the Charter can only be made with approval of a majority of voters in a regular municipal election. This recommended addition will reinforce and strengthen the requirement for community input.

The recommended change to the Charter is to assure that any proposal made by the City Council to change the Charter, must be reviewed first by a Charter Review Commission, comprised of Riverside residents. The commission would either meet on the regular 8 year review cycle or by a specially appointed commission. This prevents the City Council from unilaterally placing a proposed Charter change directly on a ballot. Since voters must ultimately approve any proposed change, it is also

Since voters must ultimately approve any proposed change, it is also appropriate that all proposed changes be reviewed by a committee of residents first. Based on the recommendation from a Charter Review Commission, the City Council would then make the final decision on whether or not to submit a proposed change to voters in a regular municipal election.

#### **MEASURE "T" - CITY OF RIVERSIDE**

#### Sec. 1103. Same—Further consideration, revision and adoption; availability to departments, etc.

After the conclusion of the public hearing, the City Council shall further consider the proposed budget and make any revisions thereof that it may deem advisable and on or before the day preceding the start of the fiscal year, it shall adopt the budget.

A copy of the adopted budget shall be placed, and shall remain on file, in the office of the City Clerk and copies shall be placed in all the public libraries in the City where they shall be available for public inspection, and a copy shall be placed on the City's accessible website where it is available for public inspection and for the use of departments, offices, and agencies of the City. The budget shall be reproduced and copies made available for the use of departments, offices and agencies of the City.

#### Sec. 1104. Same—Appropriations; transfer of funds.

From the effective date of the budget, the several amounts stated therein as proposed expenditures shall be and become appropriated to the several departments, offices, agencies, and funds for the respective objects and purposes therein named. All appropriations shall lapse at the end of the fiscal year to the extent that they shall not have been expended or lawfully encumbered, except for appropriations for <u>City Council approved</u> capital projects which shall continue to the completion of the capital projects unless a different rule has been established by action of the City Council.

At any meeting after the adoption of the budget, the City Council may amend or supplement the budget by motion adopted by the affirmative votes of at least five members so as to authorize the transfer of unused balances appropriated to one department or fund to another department or fund, or to appropriate available funds not yet included in the budget.

#### Sec. 1111. Capital projects funds

- (a) Funds for capital projects are hereby created. Capital projects initiated by the City Council which only require approval by the City Council are provided for in subsection (b). Capital projects initiated by the City Council which also require approval by the voters are provided for in subsection (c).
- (b) —A City Council-approved capital project <u>and</u> fund<u>ing</u> shall remain for the established purpose and the appropriations therein shall carry over to the completion of each project, as set forth in Section 1104. When a capital project has been completed, the City Council may transfer any unexpended or unencumbered budget to any account similarly restricted.
  - To the extent permitted by law, the City Council may levy and collect taxes for capital projects and may include in the annual tax levy a levy for such purposes in which event it must apportion and appropriate to any such account or accounts the moneys derived from such levy. It may not, in making such levy, exceed the maximum tax rate provided for in this Charter, unless authorized by the affirmative votes of two-thirds of the electors voting on the proposition at any election at which such question is submitted.
- (c) An account for a voter approved capital project shall remain inviolate for the purpose for which it was created unless the use of such funds for other capital project purposes was authorized by the electors voting on such proposition at the general or special election at which such proposition was submitted. The majority or super-majority for passage of a voter approved capital project will depend on the enabling legislation under which it is proposed. Notwithstanding the above, the proposition approving a capital project may be amended as provided in the proposition or the enabling legislation.

#### **PREAMBLE**

We, the people of the City of Riverside believe in promoting an inclusive community with shared economic, environmental and cultural prosperity, equal civil and political rights, social harmony and cohesion, and opportunities for all governed by responsible and responsive public officials who promote citizen participation, as well as just, *transparent* and equitable tax and financial policies; and these beliefs are rooted in our desire to enhance the uniqueness of the City of Riverside.

We, the people of the City of Riverside, to obtain and retain for ourselves the benefits of local government, do hereby exercise the express right granted by the Constitution and the statutes of the State of California and enact this Charter for the City of Riverside.

#### Sec. 411. Same—Citizen Person participation.

Each eitizen person shall have the right, personally or through counsel, to present comments at any regular meeting of the Council, or a Council standing or ad hoc committee, or offer suggestions with respect to municipal affairs.

#### **IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE "T"**

(Clean-up Items)

If approved by a majority of the voters, this Measure would amend the Riverside City Charter to:

- Eliminate the requirement in Section 1103 that copies of the City's adopted budget be placed in all public libraries in the City and be reproduced for City departments, offices, and agencies.
- Specify in Section 1104 that appropriations for "City Council approved" capital projects shall not lapse at the end of each fiscal year.
- Specify in Section 1111 that both a City Council approved project "and funding" shall not lapse at the end of each fiscal year.
- Add the word "transparent" to the first paragraph of the Preamble, to state: "We, the people of the City of Riverside believe in promoting an inclusive community with shared economic, environmental and cultural prosperity, equal civil and political rights, social harmony and cohesion, and opportunities for all governed by responsible and responsive public officials who promote citizen participation, as well as just, transparent and equitable tax and financial policies; and these beliefs are rooted in our desire to enhance the uniqueness of the City of Riverside."
- Replace the word "citizen" in Section 411 with the word "person" to state: "Each <u>person</u> shall have the right, personally or through counsel, to present comments at any regular meeting of the Council, or a Council standing or ad hoc committee, or offer suggestions with respect to municipal affairs."

Currently, Riverside City Charter Section 1103 requires the City to place physical copies of the City's adopted budget in all public libraries in the City and to reproduce the adopted budget for use by City departments, offices, and agencies. The proposed amendment to Riverside City Charter Section 1103 would eliminate these requirements.

Currently, Riverside City Charter Section 1104 states an exception to the requirement that all appropriations lapse at the end of the fiscal year for "appropriations for capital projects". The proposed amendment to Section 1104 would specify that the exception applies only to appropriations for "City Council approved" capital projects, consistent current practices. The proposed amendment to Section 1111 would specify that both a capital project and its funding would carry over to completion, consistent with current practices.

There is no legal effect to adding to the Riverside City Charter the word "transparent" to the Preamble, or replacing the word "citizen" with "person" in Section 411.

If this Measure is approved, the amendment to Riverside City Charter Section 1103 would reduce reproduction and distribution costs of placing physical copies of the adopted budget in all public libraries and providing copies for use by City Departments, offices, and agencies. The remaining proposed amendments would have no fiscal impact.

This Measure is being placed on this ballot by the City Council of the City of Riverside, acting upon the recommendation of the Riverside Charter Review Committee.

- 2. Complete a voter registration card or register online at RegisterToVote.ca.gov.
- 3. Vote your ballot.
- 4. Once the county elections official processes your registration and determines you are eligible, you will be registered to vote and your ballot will be counted.

The California Motor Voter program is making registering to vote at the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) more convenient and secure. All eligible individuals completing driver license or ID card or change of address transactions at the DMV will be registered to vote with the California Secretary of State unless they "opt out" of automatic voter registration.

The California Motor Voter program applies to Californians who are 18 years or older and meet the following criteria:

- A United States citizen and a resident of California.
- Not currently in state or federal prison or on parole for the conviction of a felony.
- Not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court.

Note: Voter pre-registration is available for those 16 and 17 years of age. Their voter registration will become active automatically when they turn 18.

Before visiting a DMV field office, we recommend making an appointment. Visit <a href="https://www.dmv.ca.gov/portal/dmv/detail/portal/foa/welcome">https://www.dmv.ca.gov/portal/dmv/detail/portal/foa/welcome</a> to get started. You can also use DMV online services (<a href="https://www.dmv.ca.gov/portal/dmv/dmv/onlinesvcs">https://www.dmv.ca.gov/portal/dmv/dmv/onlinesvcs</a>) to renew your driver license or ID card or change your address.

If you indicate you're eligible to vote, once you complete your driver license or state ID renewal form transaction online, by mail or in person at the DMV, your voter information is then transmitted securely and electronically to the California Secretary of State.

Please note that drivers with an AB 60 driver's license are not eligible to participate in the California Motor Voter program and are not eligible to vote.

# Remote Accessible Vote-by-Mail (RAVBM) in Riverside County

For the November 3, 2020 General Election, all voters will receive a ballot in the mail. Riverside County will begin mailing voters their ballots on October 5<sup>th</sup>.

#### You can also vote with Remote Accessible Vote-by-Mail. RAVBM lets you:

- Download, mark, and print your ballot at home
- Use your own assistive technology to read and mark the ballot
- Select the language for your ballot

RAVBM is not "internet voting." You must print and return your marked ballot.



You must request your RAVBM ballot by October 27th

#### How to vote from home (accessibly!) with RAVBM:

#### 1. Request an RAVBM ballot access link

#### 2. Mark your ballot

Use the access link to open your ballot. Review and mark the ballot on your own computer, with your own assistive technology if needed.

#### 3. Review and print your ballot

Check your ballot and make corrections. Download and print your ballot.

#### 4. Seal and sign the ballot envelope

Put your RAVBM ballot in the envelope you received in the mail. Sign the voter's declaration (punched holes tell you where to sign). Seal the envelope.

#### 5. Return your ballot

By mail. (Your envelope will include pre-paid postage!)

At any drop box in Riverside County.

At any voting location or at the Riverside County elections office.

# RIGHTS

#### YOU HAVE THE FOLLOWING RIGHTS:



The right to vote if you are a registered voter. You are eligible to vote if you are:

- a U.S. citizen living in California
- at least 18 years old
- registered where you currently live
- not currently in state or federal prison or on parole for the conviction of a felony
- not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court



The right to vote if you are a registered voter even if your name is not on the list. You will vote using a provisional ballot. Your vote will be counted if elections officials determine that you are eligible to vote.



The right to vote if you are still in line when the polls close.



The right to cast a secret ballot without anyone bothering you or telling you how to vote.



The right to get a new ballot if you have made a mistake, if you have not already cast your ballot. You can:

Ask an elections official at a polling place for a new ballot.

**Exchange your vote-by-mail ballot** for a new one at an elections office or at your polling place, or

Vote using a provisional ballot.



The right to get help casting your ballot from anyone you choose, except from your

employer or union representative.



The right to drop off your completed vote-by-mail ballot at any polling place in California.



The right to get election materials in a language other than English if enough people in your voting precinct speak that language.



The right to ask questions to elections officials about election procedures and watch the election process. If the person you ask cannot answer your questions, they must send you to the right person for an answer. If you are disruptive, they can stop answering you.



The right to report any illegal or fraudulent election activity to an elections official or the Secretary of State's office.

# **VOTE BY MAIL**

#### THE VOTING PROCESS IS DIFFERENT!

All registered voters in Riverside County will be mailed a ballot in accordance with the Governor's Executive Order.

Return your ballot as soon as possible to ensure that it is included in the first Election Night results!



**Return your ballot by mail:** If you choose to vote at home, you can return your ballot by mail (no postage required). Ballots returned by mail must be postmarked by Election Day and received by November 20, 2020.

**Drop off your ballot:** You can drop off your ballot at any secure Ballot Drop-Off box, Early Vote location, Voter Assistance Center or the Registrar of Voters office. See the list of Ballot Drop-Off locations inside this Guide, or visit our website at <a href="https://www.voteinfo.net">www.voteinfo.net</a> for more information.

#### Remote Accessible Vote by Mail Ballot (RAVBM)

Accessible Vote-by-Mail provides an accessible option for voters to mark their ballots privately and independently. To complete a RAVBM ballot visit <a href="www.voteinfo.net">www.voteinfo.net</a>. Your completed ballot and signed Oath of the Voter must be returned to the Registrar of Voters office to be counted. Return your RAVBM ballot by mail or at one of our secure Ballot Drop-Off locations.

# **VOTE IN PERSON**

The Riverside County Registrar of Voters recommends that voters only use the in-person Voter Assistance Centers if absolutely necessary, as the generalized use of in-person voting presents risks to public health and safety in light of the COVID-19 pandemic.

# Tips for California's Military and Overseas Voters

Taking part in elections is more convenient than ever for Californians serving in the military or living outside the United States. It begins when you register to vote as a military or overseas voter and receive election materials by mail, fax, or email.

- **Start early.** California's county elections officials begin sending ballots to military and overseas voters 60 days before Election Day. Fill out a voter registration application early at *RegisterToVote.ca.gov* to ensure that you receive your voting materials in time.
- **Know your options.** When registering to vote as a military or overseas voter, you can choose to have your ballot mailed, faxed, or emailed to you. You may return your voted ballot to your county elections official by mail or, in certain circumstances, by fax. If you meet the requirements to return your ballot by fax, you must also fax the Oath of Voter form (available from your county elections official) waiving your right to a confidential ballot.
- **Stay in touch.** Once you register as a military or overseas voter, you will continue to receive a ballot and election materials from your county elections official before each election. We encourage you to update your registration each year, if needed; however, you *must* re-register to vote if you change your address, your name, or your political party preference, or if you do not participate in four consecutive statewide general elections. Visit *www.sos.ca.gov/elections/voter-registration/military-overseas-voters/* for more election resources designed especially for you.

#### **Dates to remember:**

October 19: last day to register to vote and request your ballot

October 27: last day to update or change how you want to receive your ballot

**November 3:** Election Day. Mailed ballots must be postmarked on or before Election Day **and** received by your county elections office no later than November 20. Faxed ballots must be delivered to your county elections office by close of polls, no later than 8:00 p.m. Pacific Standard Time, on Election Day.

- Curbside Voting on Election Day If you are unable to enter the location due to a physical disability, you may request Curbside Voting at any voter assistance center. If you require Curbside Voting assistance you may call (877) 663-9906 before going to a voter assistance center and/or when you arrive at the facility. An Election Officer will be contacted prior to your arrival to meet you at the curb.
