Please note – this year voting is different! This Voter Information Guide contains information for the November 3, 2020 Consolidated General Election. In an effort to reduce the spread of COVID-19 and in accordance with State Law, the Riverside County Registrar of Voters will be deploying a new election model for the upcoming November 3, 2020 Election. This will offer our voters more ways and more days to vote safely. Each eligible registered voter for the November 3, 2020 Election will receive a ballot by mail beginning Monday, October 5, 2020 in accordance with the Governor's Executive Order.

Voters can verify their voter registration at <u>voterstatus.sos.ca.gov</u> or register to vote at registertovote.ca.gov.

- Your Vote-By-Mail ballot may be returned at any of our 80 secure Ballot Drop-Off locations that will be available beginning October 5, 2020 or via USPS (no postage required).
- We are now operating nearly 130 Voter Assistance Centers throughout Riverside County. You can vote in-person at any location from October 31 – November 3, 2020.
- You may track your ballot by registering at <u>WheresMyBallot.sos.ca.gov</u>.
- A list of all Ballot Drop-Off locations and Voter Assistance Centers is posted at www.voteinfo.net.

The Riverside County Registrar of Voters recommends that voters only use the in-person Voter Assistance Centers if absolutely necessary, as the generalized use of in-person voting presents risks to public health and safety in light of the COVID-19 pandemic. Social distancing will be required when visiting a Voter Assistance Center and face coverings are strongly encouraged.

Elections in California

The Top Two Candidates Open Primary Act requires that all candidates for a voter-nominated office be listed on the same ballot. Previously known as partisan offices, voter-nominated offices include state legislative offices, U.S. congressional offices, and state constitutional offices.

In both the open primary and general elections, you can vote for any candidate regardless of what party preference you indicated on your voter registration form. In the primary election, the two candidates receiving the most votes—regardless of party preference—move on to the general election. If a candidate receives a majority of the vote (at least 50 percent +1), a general election still must be held.

California's open primary system does not apply to candidates running for U.S. President, county central committees, or local offices.

Write-in candidates for voter-nominated offices can still run in the primary election. However, a write-in candidate can only move on to the general election if the candidate is one of the top two vote-getters in the primary election. Additionally, there is no independent nomination process for a general election.

California law requires the following information to be printed in this guide.

Party-Nominated/Partisan Offices

Political parties may formally nominate candidates for party-nominated/partisan offices at the primary election. A nominated candidate will represent that party as its official candidate for the specific office at the general election and the ballot will reflect an official designation. The top vote-getter for each party at the primary election moves on to the general election. Parties also elect officers of county central committees at the primary election.

A voter can only vote in the primary election of the political party he or she has disclosed a preference for upon registering to vote. However, a political party may allow a person who has declined to disclose a party preference to vote in that party's primary election.

Voter-Nominated Offices

Political parties are not entitled to formally nominate candidates for voter-nominated offices at the primary election. A candidate nominated for a voter-nominated office at the primary election is the nominee of the people and not the official nominee of any party at the general election. A candidate for nomination to a voter-nominated office shall have his or her qualified party preference, or lack of qualified party preference, stated on the ballot, but the party preference designation is selected solely by the candidate and is shown for the information of the voters only. It does not mean the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party designated, or that there is an affiliation between the party and candidate, and no candidate nominated by the voters shall be deemed to be the officially nominated candidate of any political party. In the county voter information guide, parties may list the candidates for voter-nominated offices who have received the party's official endorsement.

Any voter may vote for any candidate for a voter-nominated office, if they meet the other qualifications required to vote for that office. The top two vote-getters at the primary election move on to the general election for the voter-nominated office even if both candidates have specified the same party preference designation. No party is entitled to have a candidate with its party preference designation move on to the general election, unless the candidate is one of the two highest vote-getters at the primary election.

Nonpartisan Offices

Political parties are not entitled to nominate candidates for nonpartisan offices at the primary election, and a candidate at the primary election is not the official nominee of any party for the specific office at the general election. A candidate for nomination to a nonpartisan office may not designate his or her party preference, or lack of party preference, on the ballot. The top two vote-getters at the primary election move on to the general election for the nonpartisan office.





FULL TEXT BALLOT PROPOSITION OF THE ROMOLAND SCHOOL DISTRICT BOND MEASURE ELECTION NOVEMBER 3, 2020

The following is the full proposition presented to the voters by the Romoland School District.

To make student safety and school security improvements, repair, upgrade, and equip classrooms, labs and school facilities, support instruction in science, technology, engineering, arts and math, acquire/construct new school facilities to avoid overcrowding, shall the Romoland School District measure authorizing \$39,000,000 of bonds at legal rates, levying \$0.03 per \$100 assessed valuation (averaging \$2.2 million annually) while bonds are outstanding be adopted, requiring annual audits and citizens' oversight all money locally-controlled?

PROJECT LIST FOR THE BOND MEASURE

<u>Description of Projects.</u> The Board of Trustees of the Romoland School District is committed to improving the quality of education in local schools by providing safe, secure, updated classrooms, facilities and technology needed to support student instruction in core subjects. To addresses these needs, the Board has evaluated the facility needs for the District's schools and has determined that facilities needs exist at all 5 of its schools. In addition, the Board has concluded that reducing overcrowding is priority and a new school is essential to keep up with growth.

<u>Existing Facilities</u>. The Board has established a list of projects to be financed at the District's existing schools and facilities. The projects to be financed by the bonds to be issued by the District include the construction, rehabilitation, acquisition, equipping and furnishing of the following existing schools and facilities listed below:

Boulder Ridge Elementary School Ethan A. Chase Middle School Harvest Valley Elementary School Mesa View Elementary School Romoland Elementary School

The projects to be financed at each of the school facilities and locations listed above fall into four general categories including safety and security, infrastructure, enhanced energy efficiency and technology as further described below:

- Construction, rehabilitation and acquisition of safety and security improvements including lockdown equipment, emergency
 communication systems, fire alarm systems, cameras and video security systems, perimeter fencing and other fencing and
 improvements to create a single point of entry.
- Construction, rehabilitation, upgrading and expansion of classrooms, labs, auditoriums, cafeterias, kitchens, restrooms, physical education facilities, storage areas and other facilities including new flooring, lighting, windows, roofs, plumbing and related infrastructure and electrical systems to support instruction of science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics.
- Site improvements including resurfacing of existing exterior hard courts and physical education fields and courts, renovation
 of playground areas, new playground equipment, parking area improvements, shade structures, asphalt and concrete walkway
 rehabilitation and replacement, improvements to meet Americans for Disability Act access requirements, and landscaping,
 and rehabilitation of building exteriors.
- Energy efficiency improvements including heating, ventilation and air conditioning installation and replacement, and window replacement to improve classroom environments.
- Replacement of modular classroom space with new modular or permanent classrooms for current and future program needs.
- Added space for school support programs, including dedicated offices, conference rooms, family resource centers and other support areas.
- Equipment and related technology improvements for all classrooms and other facilities, including video and communication
 equipment and systems, hardware and software, and computers, tablets, wireless devices and software for individual student
 use, as well as modernizing technology servers at the District and in its schools.

Whenever specific items are included in the list above, they are presented to provide an example and are not intended to limit the generality of the broader description of authorized projects.

New School Facilities. The projects to be financed with bond proceeds also include the acquisition, construction, equipping and furnishing of a new school to reduce overcrowding as student enrollment increases. This project may include the acquisition of a site at a location to be determined in the future and the construction, equipping and furnishing of all elements of a new school, including, but not limited to, classrooms, career technical education facilities, science and computer labs, auditoriums, gymnasiums, fields and stadiums, cafeterias, administration and support facilities, parking, playgrounds, hardscape, energy efficiency improvements, landscaping, furnishings and equipment.

Implementation of Construction and Bond Program. Listed projects will be completed only as needed and the above order in the listing of

projects does not imply a particular prioritization among projects. Decisions regarding the scope, timing, prioritization or other facets of project implementation will be made solely by the Board of Trustees by subsequent action. Projects may be done in phases, based on Board of Trustees priorities. Listed projects may be completed at any and all District schools, sites and education buildings where such projects are determined necessary by the Board of Trustees. Where terms such as "rehabilitation" and "replacement" are used in the foregoing Project List for the Bond Measure, the Board of Trustees shall determine the best method for accomplishing the project's objective. For any listed project involving renovation of all or a portion of a building, the District may proceed with new replacement construction instead (including any necessary demolition), if the District determines that replacement and new construction is more practical than renovation, considering the building's age, condition, expected remaining life, comparative cost, and other relevant factors.

Each project financed will include its share of architectural, engineering, and similar planning costs, program management, project or construction management, a contingency for unforeseen circumstances, offsite/utility connection costs, and interim housing. Projects also may include the payment of the costs of preparation of all facility planning, facility assessment reviews, environmental studies, construction documentation, plan check, inspection and permit fees and costs for temporary facilities, furnishings and equipment necessary in connection with construction activities.

The projects may include the acquisition of improvements on the project list that are financed by the District on an interim basis through temporary loans, leases, lease-leaseback, or lease-purchase arrangements.

The District intends to apply for State matching funds for all eligible projects to be financed. In the absence of such funding, the District may not be able to undertake some of the projects listed above. Approval of this proposition does not guarantee that the proposed projects that are the subject of this proposition will be funded beyond the local revenues generated by this proposition. The District's receipt of matching State funds will be subject to appropriation by the Legislature and approval of a statewide bond measure. In the absence of State matching funds, which the District will pursue to reduce the District's share of the costs of the projects, the District may not be able to complete some of the projects listed above.

The budget for each project is an estimate and may be affected by factors beyond the District's control. The final cost of each project will be determined as plans are finalized, construction bids are awarded and projects are completed. Based on the final costs of each project, certain of the projects described above may be delayed or may not be completed.

FISCAL ACCOUNTABILITY REQUIREMENTS

The provisions in this section are specifically included in this proposition in order that the voters and taxpayers in the District may be assured that their money will be spent only to address specific facilities needs of the District in compliance with the requirements of Article XIIIA, Section I (b)(3), of the State Constitution and the Strict Accountability in Local School Construction Bonds Act of 2000 (codified at Education Code Sections 15264 and following.)

<u>Evaluation of Needs</u>. The Board hereby certifies that it has evaluated safety, class size reduction and information technology needs in developing the project list contained in this ballot proposition.

<u>Independent Citizens' Oversight Committee</u>. The Board shall establish an Independent Citizens' Oversight Committee pursuant to Education Code Section 15278 and following to ensure bond proceeds are expended only on the projects listed in this ballot proposition. The committee shall be established within 60 days of the date when the results of the election appear in the minutes of the Board.

<u>Performance Audits</u>. The Board shall conduct an annual, independent performance audit to ensure that the bond proceeds have been expanded only on the projects listed in this ballot proposition.

<u>Financial Audits</u>. The Board shall conduct an annual, independent financial audit of the bond proceeds until all of those proceeds have been spent for the projects listed in this ballot proposition.

Special Bond Proceeds Account: Annual Report to Board. Upon approval of this proposition and the sale of any bonds approved, the Board shall take actions necessary to establish an account in which proceeds of the sale of bonds will be deposited which will be a Building Fund to be held by the Riverside County Treasurer, as required by the California Education Code. As long as any proceeds of the bonds remain unexpended, the Superintendent of the District shall cause a report to be filed with the Board annually stating (1) the amount of bond proceeds received and expended in that year, and (2) the status of any project funded or to be funded from bond proceeds. The report may relate to the calendar year, fiscal year, or other appropriate annual period as the Superintendent shall determine and may be incorporated in the annual budget, audit, or another appropriate routine report to the Board.

ADDITIONAL SPECIFICATIONS

<u>Terms of the Bonds</u>. The bonds may be issued and sold in several series in accordance with the financing plan determined by the Board of Trustees. Bonds may be issued pursuant to the Education Code or the Government Code in the discretion of the Board of Trustees with final maturity dates and at interest rates not exceeding the legal limits.

<u>Limit on Use of Bond Proceeds</u>. Proceeds from the sale of bonds authorized by this proposition may be used only for the construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation or replacement of school facilities including the furnishing and equipping of school facilities or acquisition or lease of real property for school facilities and not for any other purpose, including teacher and administrator salaries not related to oversight of the projects to be constructed with the bonds and other school operating expenses. Proceeds of the bonds may be used to pay or reimburse the District for the cost of District staff when performing work on or necessary and incidental to the projects being financed.

MEASURE "P" - ROMOLAND SCHOOL DISTRICT

Tax Rate Statement Romoland School District Bond Proposition November 3, 2020 Election

An election will be held in the Romoland School District (the "District") on November 3, 2020, to authorize the sale of up to \$39,000,000 in bonds of the District to finance improvements to educational facilities as described in the proposition. If such bonds are authorized and sold, principal and interest on the bonds will be payable only from the proceeds of *ad valorem* tax levies made upon the taxable property in the District. The following information is provided in compliance with Sections 9400-9404 of the Elections Code of the State of California.

Based upon the foregoing and projections of the District's assessed valuation, the following information is provided:

- The best estimate of the average annual tax rate which would be required to be levied to fund this bond issue over the entire duration of the bond debt service, based on a projection of assessed valuations available at the time of filing this statement, is 3 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation (or \$30.00 per \$100,000 of assessed valuation). The final fiscal year in which it is anticipated that the tax will be collected is 2058-59.
- 2. The best estimate of the highest tax rate which would be required to be levied to fund this bond issue, based on a projection of assessed valuations available at the time of filing this statement, is 3 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation (or \$30.00 per \$100,000 of assessed valuation). It is estimated that such rate would be levied in fiscal year 2021-22.
- 3. The best estimate of the total debt service, including the principal and interest that would be required to be repaid if all the bonds are issued and sold, is approximately \$83.9 million.

Voters should note the estimated tax rate is based on the assessed value (not market value) of taxable property on the County's official tax rolls. In addition, taxpayers eligible for a property tax exemption, such as the homeowner's exemption, will be taxed at a lower effective tax rate than described above. Certain taxpayers may also be eligible to postpone payment of taxes. Property owners should consult their own property tax bills and tax advisors to determine their property's assessed value and any applicable tax exemptions.

The attention of all voters is directed to the fact that the foregoing information is based upon projections and estimates only. The actual tax rates and the years in which they will apply may vary from those presently estimated, due to variations from these estimates in the timing of bond sales, the amount of bonds sold and market interest rates at the time of each sale, and actual assessed valuations over the term of repayment of the bonds. The date of sale and the amount of bonds sold at any given time will be determined by the District based on its need for construction funds and other factors. The actual interest rates at which the bonds will be sold will depend on the bond market at the time of sale. Actual future assessed valuations will depend upon the amount and value of taxable property within the District as determined by the County Assessor in the annual assessment and the equalization process. Accordingly, the actual tax rates and the years in which such rates are applicable may vary from those presently estimated as stated above.

IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE "P"

The Board of Trustees ("Board") of the Romoland School District ("District") by adopting Resolution No. 31-2019/2020 ("Resolution"), elected to call an election pursuant to Section 18 of Article XVI and Section 1 of Article XIIIA of the California Constitution and Section 15100 and 15264 et seq. of the California Education Code to obtain authorization to issue and sell general obligation Bonds ("Bonds") in the aggregate amount principal amount of thirty-nine million dollars (\$39,000,000).

This Measure was placed on the ballot by the Board of the District.

The Bonds would be used by the District to rehabilitate, improve, and construct new buildings and facilities, equip and upgrade safety and security systems, and modernize technology infrastructure and energy efficiency. The Bonds may be used to construct, acquire, equip and furnish a new school. The Bonds would not be used to fund the salaries, pensions or benefits of any board members, administrator, and/or teachers or for other school operating expenses.

If Measure P is approved, the Board of the District will appoint a citizens' oversight committee, and conduct annual independent financial and performance audits to ensure that bond funds are spent only on the construction, rehabilitation, and modernization of school facilities, furnishings and/or equipment, or the acquisition or construction of property for school facilities, and for no other purposes.

An ad valorem tax would be levied and collected on property within the boundaries of the District to pay the principal and interest on the Bonds. The best estimate of the average annual tax rate at this time is approximately \$0.03 per \$100 per assessment (or \$30.00 per \$100,000) of assessed value. The final year in which the tax is anticipated to be collected is 2058-2059.

The Resolution provides that the maximum interest rate on the Bonds will not exceed the maximum statutory interest and the maximum term of the Bonds, or any series thereof, will not exceed the maximum statutory term. The best estimate of the total debt service, including the principal and interest, that would be required to be repaid if all of the bonds are issued and sold is \$83,900,000.

Approval of Measure P does not guarantee that the proposed projects in the District, that are the subject of the Bonds under Measure P, will be funded beyond the local revenues generated by Measure P. The District's proposal for the project or projects may assume the receipt of matching state funds, which could be subject to appropriation by the Legislature or approval of a statewide bond measure.

For this Measure to be approved fifty-five percent (55%) of qualified voters who vote on the Measure must vote yes.

A "YES" vote on Measure "P" is a vote to allow the District to sell the Bonds and levy the necessary taxes to pay for the Bonds.

A "NO" vote on Measure "P" is a vote against allowing the District to sell the Bonds and levy the necessary taxes to pay for the Bonds.

Conditional Voter Registration

Did you forget to register or update your voter registration? No Problem! A new law allows you to register to vote and vote until 8:00 p.m. on Election Day at your county elections office or at any voter assistance center in your county. This process is called Conditional Voter Registration (CVR) and is commonly referred to as Same Day Voter Registration. Here's how it works:

- 1. Visit the Registrar of Voters office or any Voter Assistance Center.
- 2. Complete a voter registration card or register online at RegisterToVote.ca.gov.
- 3. Vote your ballot.
- 4. Once the county elections official processes your registration and determines you are eligible, you will be registered to vote and your ballot will be counted.

California Motor Voter

The California Motor Voter program is making registering to vote at the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) more convenient and secure. All eligible individuals completing driver license or ID card or change of address transactions at the DMV will be registered to vote with the California Secretary of State unless they "opt out" of automatic voter registration.

The California Motor Voter program applies to Californians who are 18 years or older and meet the following criteria:

- A United States citizen and a resident of California.
- Not currently in state or federal prison or on parole for the conviction of a felony.
- Not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court.

Note: Voter pre-registration is available for those 16 and 17 years of age. Their voter registration will become active automatically when they turn 18.

Before visiting a DMV field office, we recommend making an appointment. Visit https://www.dmv.ca.gov/portal/dmv/detail/portal/foa/welcome to get started. You can also use DMV online services (https://www.dmv.ca.gov/portal/dmv/dmv/onlinesvcs) to renew your driver license or ID card or change your address.

If you indicate you're eligible to vote, once you complete your driver license or state ID renewal form transaction online, by mail or in person at the DMV, your voter information is then transmitted securely and electronically to the California Secretary of State.

Please note that drivers with an AB 60 driver's license are not eligible to participate in the California Motor Voter program and are not eligible to vote.

Remote Accessible Vote-by-Mail (RAVBM) in Riverside County

For the November 3, 2020 General Election, all voters will receive a ballot in the mail. Riverside County will begin mailing voters their ballots on October 5th.

You can also vote with Remote Accessible Vote-by-Mail. RAVBM lets you:

- Download, mark, and print your ballot at home
- Use your own assistive technology to read and mark the ballot
- Select the language for your ballot

RAVBM is not "internet voting." You must print and return your marked ballot.



You must request your RAVBM ballot by October 27th

How to vote from home (accessibly!) with RAVBM:

1. Request an RAVBM ballot access link

2. Mark your ballot

Use the access link to open your ballot. Review and mark the ballot on your own computer, with your own assistive technology if needed.

Check your ballot and make corrections. Download and print your ballot.

4. Seal and sign the ballot envelope

Put your RAVBM ballot in the envelope you received in the mail. Sign the voter's declaration (punched holes tell you where to sign). Seal the envelope.

5. Return your ballot

By mail. (Your envelope will include pre-paid postage!)

At any drop box in Riverside County.

At any voting location or at the Riverside County elections office.

YOU HAVE THE FOLLOWING RIGHTS:



The right to vote if you are a registered voter. You are eligible to vote if you are:

- a U.S. citizen living in California

- not currently in state or federal prison or on parole for the conviction of a felony
- not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court



The right to vote if you are a registered voter even if your name is not on the list. You will vote using a provisional ballot. Your vote will be counted if elections officials determine that you are eligible to vote.



The right to vote if you are still in line when the polls close.



The right to cast a secret ballot without anyone bothering you or telling you how to vote.



The right to get a new ballot if you have made a mistake, if you have not already cast your ballot. You can:

Ask an elections official at a polling place for a new ballot.

Exchange your vote-by-mail ballot for a new one at an elections office or at your polling place, or

Vote using a provisional ballot.



The right to get help casting your ballot from anyone you choose, except from your

employer or union representative.



The right to drop off your completed vote-by-mail ballot at any polling place in California.



The right to get election materials in a language other than English if enough people in your voting precinct speak that language.



The right to ask questions to elections officials about election procedures and watch the election process. If the person you ask cannot answer your questions, they must send you to the right person for an answer. If you are disruptive, they can stop answering you.



The right to report any illegal or fraudulent election activity to an elections official or the Secretary of State's office.
