Election Day is just around the corner on November 5, 2024! Your County Voter Information Guide is here, providing essential details for voting, including instructions on marking your ballot, candidate information, a sample ballot, and other important election details to review before you vote. Tip: You can mark your sample ballot and bring it with you to any Vote Center for easy reference.

Starting October 7, 2024, ballots will be mailed to all active registered voters. You can check your registration at [voterstatus.sos.ca.gov](https://voterstatus.sos.ca.gov) or register at [registertovote.ca.gov](https://registertovote.ca.gov).

Vote at any vote center. We have more days and more ways to cast your ballot!

- **Returning Your Ballot:** You may drop off your ballot at any secure ballot Drop-Off Location starting October 7, 2024, or mail your ballot via USPS (no postage needed).
- **Receiving Your Ballot:** Your ballot must be received by the Registrar of Voters by Election Day or postmarked on Election Day and received within seven days (November 12, 2024).
- **Tracking Your Ballot:** Register at [WheresMyBallot.sos.ca.gov](https://WheresMyBallot.sos.ca.gov).

**Early Voting:** Vote in person at the Registrar of Voters office starting October 7, 2024, (excluding holidays) 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Hours change on October 26 - 27, and November 2 - 3 to 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. For a list of locations and hours, visit [voteinfo.net](https://voteinfo.net).

**Election Day:** All Vote Centers, including the Registrar of Voters office, will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

# Elections in California

The Top Two Candidates Open Primary Act requires that all candidates for a voter-nominated office be listed on the same ballot. Previously known as partisan offices, voter-nominated offices include state legislative offices, United States congressional offices, and state constitutional offices.

In both the open primary and general elections, you can vote for any candidate regardless of what party preference you indicated on your voter registration form. In the primary election, the two candidates receiving the most votes—regardless of party preference—move on to the general election. If a candidate receives a majority of the vote (at least 50 percent + 1), a general election still must be held.

Write-in candidates for voter-nominated offices may still run in the primary election. However, a write-in candidate may only move on to the general election if the candidate is one of the top two vote-getters in the primary election. Additionally, there is no independent nomination process for a general election.

California's open primary system does not apply to candidates running for United States President, county central committee, or local offices.

California law requires the following information to be printed in this guide.

## Party-Nominated/Partisan Offices

Political parties may formally nominate candidates for party-nominated/partisan offices at the primary election. A nominated candidate will represent that party as its official candidate for the specific office at the general election and the ballot will reflect an official designation. The top vote-getter for each party at the primary election moves on to the general election. Parties also elect officers of county central committees at the primary election.

A voter can only vote in the primary election of the political party he or she has disclosed a preference for upon registering to vote. However, a political party may allow a person who has declined to disclose a party preference to vote in that party's primary election.

## Voter-Nominated Offices

Political parties are not entitled to formally nominate candidates for voter-nominated offices at the primary election. A candidate nominated for a voter-nominated office at the primary election is the nominee of the people and not the official nominee of any party at the general election. A candidate for nomination to a voter-nominated office shall have his or her qualified party preference, or lack of qualified party preference, stated on the ballot, but the party preference designation is selected solely by the candidate and is shown for the information of the voters only. It does not mean the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party designated, or that there is an affiliation between the party and candidate, and no candidate nominated by the voters shall be deemed to be the officially nominated candidate of any political party. In the county voter information guide, parties may list the candidates for voter-nominated offices who have received the party's official endorsement.

Any voter may vote for any candidate for a voter-nominated office, if they meet the other qualifications required to vote for that office. The top two vote-getters at the primary election move on to the general election for the voter-nominated office even if both candidates have specified the same party preference designation. No party is entitled to have a candidate with its party preference designation move on to the general election unless the candidate is one of the two highest vote-getters at the primary election.

## Nonpartisan Offices

Political parties are not entitled to nominate candidates for nonpartisan offices at the primary election, and a candidate at the primary election is not the official nominee of any party for the specific office at the general election. A candidate for nomination to a nonpartisan office may not designate his or her party preference, or lack of party preference, on the ballot. The top two vote-getters at the primary election move on to the general election for the nonpartisan office.

**MEASURE “N” - CITY OF HEMET**

**ORDINANCE NO. 2037**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF HEMET, CALIFORNIA,  
AMENDING SECTIONS 74-71 THROUGH 74-73 OF THE HEMET MUNICIPAL CODE  
TO INCREASE THE TRANSIENT OCCUPANCY TAX**

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has placed a measure to increase the transient occupancy tax before the voters at the general election to be held on November 5, 2024; and

**WHEREAS**, the measure received the requisite votes for adoption.

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE PEOPLE OF HEMET DO HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION 1.** The definition of “hotel” in Section 74-71 of the Hemet Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Hotel means any structure or any portion of any structure which is occupied or intended or designed for occupancy by transients for dwelling, lodging or sleeping purposes, and includes any hotel, inn, tourist home or house, short term rental, bed and breakfast, motel, studio hotel, bachelor hotel, lodging house, rooming house, apartment house, dormitory, public or private club, mobile home or house trailer at a fixed location, recreational vehicle park, campground, or parking area, or any other property rented to a “transient” or other similar structure or portion thereof.”

**SECTION 2.** Section 74-72 of the Hemet Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

**“Sec. 74-72. Tax Imposed.**

For the privilege of occupancy in any hotel, each transient is subject to, and shall pay tax in the amount of twelve (12) percent of the rent charged by the operator. Such tax constitutes a debt owed by the transient to the city which is extinguished only by payment to the operator or to the city. The transient shall pay the tax to the operator of the hotel at the time the rent is paid. If the rent is paid in installments, a proportionate share of the tax shall be paid with each installment. The unpaid tax shall be due upon the transient's ceasing to occupy space in the hotel. If for any reason the tax due is not paid to the operator of the hotel, the tax administrator may require that such tax shall be paid directly to the tax administrator.

The tax administrator may make rules and regulations not inconsistent with the provisions of this article as may be necessary and desirable to aid in the enforcement and administration of this article. Any such rule or regulation that may affect the amount of tax owed to the city shall be subject to approval by the city council. The rules and regulations shall be filed in the office of the tax administrator and maintained by the city clerk in an orderly and accessible manner. Taxes are considered paid only upon receipt of the return, and penalty, interest, and completed exemption certificate when appropriate. The burden to secure and comply with the rules and regulations shall be upon the operator.”

**SECTION 3.** Section 74-73 of the Hemet Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

**“Sec. 74-73. Exemptions.**

(a) No tax shall be imposed under this article upon:

(1) Any of the exclusions or exemptions set forth in California Revenue and Tax Code section 7280, et seq., as may be amended from time to time.

(2) Any federal or state officer or employee when on official business.

(3) Any officer or employee of a foreign government who is exempt by reason of express provision of federal law or international treaty.

(b) No exemption shall be granted except upon a claim therefor made at the time rent is collected and under penalty of perjury upon a form prescribed by the tax administrator. When a claim of exemption is defective, the operator: (1) shall be responsible for all taxes due with respect to the purported exempt transient; and (2) the tax administrator shall give notice to the operator of all taxes due as a result of the rejection of the exemption claim. The operator shall pay all sums due within ten working days of notification.”

**SECTION 4.** This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval by a majority of those voting on the measure at the November 5, 2024 election.

### IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE "N"

On June 25, 2024, the City Council voted to place Measure "N" on the November 5, 2024 general municipal election ballot. By placing Measure "N" on the ballot, the City of Hemet complies with the California Constitution, which requires a majority of the voters to approve an ordinance that establishes a general tax.

The City of Hemet currently imposes a ten percent (10%) Transient Occupancy Tax ("TOT") on persons who rent space at hotels for a period of 30 days or less. If approved by a majority of Hemet voters, this Measure would authorize an increase in the TOT by two percent to a new rate of twelve percent (12%). It is estimated that the measure will increase annual revenues by \$200,000 per year.

The additional revenues will be available to address homelessness, make public areas safer and cleaner, including streets and sidewalks, and other essential government services such as 911 response, pothole repair, senior and youth programs, improving public arts and culture, and parks and recreational facilities. The TOT would continue as to be a "general tax," meaning that revenues raised from the tax would go into the City's general fund to pay for any lawful City program, improvement, or service.

If approved, the new tax rate would remain in effect until ended by Hemet voters voting at a subsequent election. All revenues raised by the tax would remain in the City and would not be shared with the State, County, or any other agency. The revenues and expenditures generated by the tax would be subject to the same independent audit requirements as other city revenues and expenditures.

A "yes" vote on Measure "N" will authorize the increase in the TOT rate to 12%

A "no" vote on Measure "N" will not authorize the increase in the TOT rate to 12%

#### ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE "N"

#### REBUTTAL TO ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE "N"

The current General Fund Budget of the City of Hemet is approximately \$80,000,000 (Eighty Million Dollars). 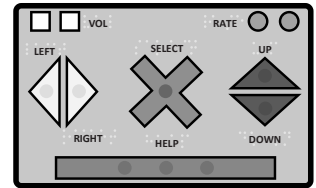

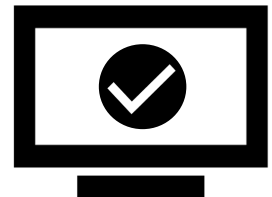


### Remote Accessible Vote by Mail (RAVBM)

# VOTER BILL OF RIGHTS

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## YOU HAVE THE FOLLOWING RIGHTS:

- ★ 1 The right to vote if you are a registered voter.**  
You are eligible to vote if you are:
  - a U.S. citizen living in California
  - at least 18 years old
  - registered where you currently live
  - not currently serving a state or federal prison term for the conviction of a felony
  - not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court
- ★ 2 The right to vote if you are a registered voter even if your name is not on the list.** You will vote using a provisional ballot. Your vote will be counted if elections officials determine that you are eligible to vote.
- ★ 3 The right to vote if you are still in line when the polls close.**
- ★ 4 The right to cast a secret ballot** without anyone bothering you or telling you how to vote.
- ★ 5 The right to get a new ballot if you have made a mistake,** if you have not already cast your ballot. You can:
  - Ask an elections official at a polling place** for a new ballot,
  - Exchange your vote-by-mail ballot** for a new one at an elections office, or
  - at your polling place, or**
  - Vote using a provisional ballot.**
- ★ 6 The right to get help casting your ballot** from anyone you choose, except from your employer or union representative.
- ★ 7 The right to drop off your completed vote-by-mail ballot at any polling place** in California.
- ★ 8 The right to get election materials in a language other than English** if enough people in your voting precinct speak that language.
- ★ 9 The right to ask questions to elections officials about election procedures** and watch the election process. If the person you ask cannot answer your questions, they must send you to the right person for an answer. If you are disruptive, they can stop answering you.
- ★ 10 The right to report any illegal or fraudulent election activity** to an elections official or the Secretary of State's office.

## ACCOMMODATIONS FOR VOTERS WITH DISABILITIES

All Vote Centers are accessible to voters who are physically disabled. Please be advised of the following alternate ways you may cast your ballot.

- **Remote Accessible Vote by Mail Ballot (RAVBM)** - Accessible Vote-by-Mail provides an accessible option for voters to mark their ballots privately and independently. - **Curbside Voting on Election Day** - If you are unable to enter the location due to a physical disability, you may request Curbside Voting at any Vote Center. Curbside Voting doorbells and signs are available at all Vote Centers. If you require Curbside Voting assistance you may call (877) 663-9906 before going to a Vote Center and/or when you arrive at the facility. An Election Officer will be contacted prior to your arrival to meet you at the curb.
- **Large Print State Voter Information Guide** - If you prefer a large print State Voter Information Guide, you may request one by contacting the California Secretary of State's office at (800) 345-VOTE (8683), or by contacting the Registrar of Voters office at (951) 486-7200, (800) 773-VOTE (8683), California Relay Service (Dial 711).
