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Dear Voter:

**November 7, 2017 is Election Day.** This County Voter Information Guide provides ballot marking instructions, polling place location, candidate information, and other important election details that you should review before you vote. You may mark your selections on your Sample Ballot and take it with you to the polls for easy reference.

You have several options for voting:

**Vote-by-Mail** – Voting by mail is convenient and easy. You will find an application to receive a Vote-by-Mail ballot on the back cover of this guide. The deadline to request a Vote-by-Mail ballot is October 31. You have several options for returning your ballot:

- Mail your ballot in time to reach the Registrar of Voters Office by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, or be postmarked on or before Election Day and received no later than three days after Election Day to be counted.
- Return your ballot in person to the Registrar of Voters Office during regular business hours and until close of polls on Election Day. For your convenience the Registrar's office has a secure locked drop box at its entry for ballot drop off 24 hours a day.
- Deposit your ballot in one of the secure drop-off boxes available at designated City Clerks' Offices from October 10 through November 6. Please visit our website to view a map of ballot drop-off locations.
- Take your ballot to any polling place, vote center, or ballot drop-off location within the state no later than the close of the polls on Election Day.
- You may confirm that the Registrar of Voters Office has received your returned Vote-by-Mail ballot on our website at [www.voteinfo.net](http://www.voteinfo.net).
- **Vote First, Count First!** Vote-by-Mail ballots received before Election Day are counted first. Return your ballot as soon as possible to ensure that it is included in the first Election Night results!

**Early Voting** – Vote at the Registrar of Voters Office beginning October 10 through November 6 (excluding Holidays), Monday through Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.; Saturday, October 28 and November 4, from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.; and Election Day, November 7, from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Early voting will also be available at the Palm Springs Public Library on Friday, October 27 and Saturday, October 28, from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Please visit our website at [www.voteinfo.net](http://www.voteinfo.net) for additional early voting information.

**Vote on Election Day November 7** – See the back cover of this County Voter Information Guide for your Polling Place location.

Have you considered participating in the Electoral process? We need you to volunteer to work the polls on Election Day! We are eager to train you to assist voters with their fundamental right to vote. Please contact us for more information.

The Registrar of Voters team is here to serve you. Please contact us anytime, so we can help make your voting experience a positive one. Thank you for participating in this election -- your vote counts!

### IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE “G”

The City of Perris owns a municipal sewer system located in the City's Downtown area. The sewer system provides service to approximately 2,366 connections and consists of pipelines, lift stations, and other facilities required to collect and transport sewage to the Eastern Municipal Water District treatment plant.

Measure G asks the City's voters to decide whether to authorize the sale of the City's sewer system.

Pursuant to the California Public Utilities Code, in order to sell the sewer system the City must first submit the question to the City's voters. If the measure is approved the City may then set a date for receiving bids. When bids are received the City may sell the sewer system to the highest and best bidder. At its meeting on July 27, 2017, the City Council adopted an ordinance placing Measure G on the ballot at the Special Municipal Election to be held on November 7, 2017.

As reported in the written and oral staff reports at the public hearing on the ordinance, the sewer system has experienced annual operating deficits. If Measure G does not pass, the City will retain the sewer system and the annual deficits are expected to continue.

A YES vote means the City can move forward with the bidding process to sell the sewer system. As stated on the ballot measure, if the sale is completed the City will use the proceeds to retire debt related to the water systems and then for park amenities, including athletic fields.

A NO vote means the City cannot move forward with the bidding process. The City would retain ownership of the sewer system, including the responsibility to fund operating costs and future capital improvements, maintenance and repairs.

If two-thirds of the voters voting in the election vote YES, Measure G will pass.

Residents who are not customers of the City's sewer system receive sewer service from Eastern Municipal Water District. That will not change if Measure G passes.

### ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE “G”

Perris is a family-oriented community that focuses on providing recreational opportunities for the youth of the City. City leaders are committed to looking for additional funding to provide parks and athletic fields for the residents of Perris.

**Measure G is good for Perris.** After careful consideration, the City Council placed Measure G on the ballot to seek voter approval to sell the City's sewer system. The City's sewer system infrastructure is expected to need substantial maintenance and replacement in the coming years. Although the sewer system only serves a portion of Perris, part of the cost of the sewer system will be paid by all Perris taxpayers.

**Putting taxpayer funds to work for the community:** The money from the sale will be used to retire debt and to fund parks and athletic fields. Passing Measure G brings funds to the City which will be reinvested for the public good.

**Quality reliable sewer service:** Measure G authorizes a competitive bidding process designed to identify a partner who will work with the City to provide quality service, maintain the sewer system and provide reasonable rates.

**A Yes vote is good for the residents of Perris:** Protecting taxpayer funds and providing quality public services is a top priority. Measure G will protect residents, provide sewer service stability and ensure we have the best possible parks and athletic fields for families, kids and the community.

Please vote Yes on Measure G to ensure quality sewer service and protect taxpayers.

### IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE “H”

The City of Perris owns two municipal water systems. The “Downtown Water System” is located in the City’s Downtown area and provides service to approximately 2,366 connections. The “North Perris Water System” is located in the North Perris area and provides services to approximately 1,357 connections in the Villages of Avalon. (Note: This analysis assumes the transfer of the North Perris Water System from the Perris Public Utilities Authority to the City will occur prior to the election.)

Measure H asks the City’s voters to decide whether to authorize the sale of the City’s water systems to Liberty Utilities (“Liberty”).

Pursuant to the California Public Utilities Code, the City issued a request for proposals soliciting proposals from interested public utilities to purchase the water systems. After conducting a noticed public hearing and evaluating the proposals received, the City Council found that Liberty is the best qualified public utility to continue providing equal or better service to the customers of the systems. Liberty proposes to purchase the systems for \$11,500,000. The City Council selected Liberty as the proposed buyer and placed Measure H on the ballot at the Special Municipal Election to be held on November 7, 2017.

As reported in the written and oral staff reports at the public hearing, the water systems are currently in debt and have experienced annual operating deficits. The General Fund pays for these deficits, which means there is less money in the General Fund for public services benefiting all City residents. If Measure H does not pass, the City will retain the water systems and the annual deficits are expected to continue, adding to the debt and requiring further General Fund contributions.

Liberty provides water service to 12 incorporated cities in California and to unincorporated areas in San Bernardino and Los Angeles Counties. The California Public Utilities Commission (“CPUC”) regulates Liberty, and the water rates charged by Liberty must be approved by the CPUC. The proposed purchase agreement will limit annual water rate increases for 10 years. Annual increases are limited to annual increases in Eastern Municipal Water District rates or 3.3%, whichever is higher, with some exceptions for water supply changes or catastrophic events.

A YES vote means the City can move forward with an agreement to sell the water systems to Liberty. If the sale is completed the City will receive approximately \$11,500,000. As stated in the ballot measure, these funds will be used to retire debt related to the water systems and then for park amenities, including athletic fields.

A NO vote means the City cannot move forward with an agreement. The City would retain ownership of the water systems, including the responsibility to fund operating costs and future capital improvements, maintenance and repairs.

If a majority of voters voting in the election vote YES, Measure H will pass.

Residents who are not customers of the Downtown Water System or North Perris Water System receive water service from Eastern Municipal Water District (“EMWD”). That will not change if Measure H passes.

## Conditional Voter Registration

Effective January 1, 2017, Conditional Voter Registration is available to eligible voters in California pursuant to Election Codes 2170 through 2173.

Conditional Voter Registration (CVR) extends the existing 15-day registration deadline to eligible voters, allowing them to register and vote 14 days prior to an election through Election Day. An eligible voter would need to register directly in the office of the Riverside County Registrar of Voters, located at 2724 Gateway Drive, in Riverside, CA 92507 to conditionally register to vote and vote a provisional ballot.

Voters may register online at [www.registertovote.ca.gov](http://www.registertovote.ca.gov), however, **CVR ballots will only be issued at the office of the Registrar of Voters.**

In order to conditionally register, the voter must first complete an affidavit of registration (also known as a Voter Registration Card). Once the registration is submitted, the Registrar of Voters will issue a CVR provisional ballot to vote.

The affidavit will be processed and once the eligibility is determined and validated, the registration will become permanent and the CVR provisional ballot will be counted.

Conditional Voter Registrations are treated and processed in the same manner as other registrations; CVR provisional ballots are treated and processed the same as other provisional ballots.

*CVR was enacted in 2012, to be operative on January 1st after the certification of a statewide voter registration database. VoteCal, California's statewide voter registration database, was certified on September 26, 2016; CVR became operative as of January 1, 2017.*



# VOTER BILL *of* RIGHTS



## YOU HAVE THE FOLLOWING RIGHTS



1. **The right to vote if you are a registered voter.** You are eligible to vote if you are:

- ★ a U.S. citizen living in California    ★ registered where you currently live
- ★ at least 18 years old    ★ not in prison or on parole for a felony

2. **The right to vote if you are a registered voter even if your name is not on the list.**

You will vote using a provisional ballot. Your vote will be counted if elections officials determine that you are eligible to vote.

3. **The right to vote if you are still in line when the polls close.**

4. **The right to cast a secret ballot** without anyone bothering you or telling you how to vote.

5. **The right to get a new ballot if you have made a mistake**, if you have not already cast your ballot. You can:  
**Ask an elections official at a polling place** for a new ballot; or  
**Exchange your vote-by-mail ballot** for a new one at an elections office, or at your polling place; or  
**Vote using a provisional ballot**, if you do not have your original vote-by-mail ballot.

6. **The right to get help casting your ballot** from anyone you choose, except from your employer or union representative.

7. **The right to drop off your completed vote-by-mail ballot at any polling place** within the state of California.

8. **The right to get election materials in a language other than English** if enough people in your voting precinct speak that language.

9. **The right to ask questions to elections officials about election procedures** and watch the election process. If the person you ask cannot answer your questions, they must send you to the right person for an answer. If you are disruptive, they can stop answering you.

10. **The right to report any illegal or fraudulent election activity** to an elections official or the Secretary of State's office.

### SPECIAL NOTICE

- Polls are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on the day indicated in the posted county Voter Information Guide.
- Specific instructions on how to vote, including how to cast a provisional ballot, can be obtained from a poll worker or by reading the information mailed to you by your local elections official.
- If you are a newly registered voter, you may be asked to provide appropriate identification or other documentation according to federal law. But please note that every individual has the right to cast a provisional ballot even if he or she does not provide the documentation.
- It is against the law to represent yourself as being eligible to vote unless you meet all of the requirements to vote under federal and state law.
- It is against the law to tamper with voting equipment.

A "YES" or "NO" printed under the disabled symbol/arrow on the back cover of this guide indicates whether or not your assigned polling place is accessible to physically disabled voters. Please be advised of the following alternate ways you may cast your ballot.
