This County Voter Information Guide provides ballot marking instructions, candidate information and other important election information that you should review before you vote. You may mark your selections on your Sample Ballot and take it with you to any Vote Center for easy reference. Each eligible registered voter for the November 8, 2022, Consolidated General Election will receive a ballot by mail beginning Tuesday, October 11, 2022.

Voters can verify their voter registration at <u>voterstatus.sos.ca.gov</u> or register to vote at <u>registertovote.ca.gov</u>.

- Your Vote-by-Mail ballot may be returned at any secure Ballot Drop-off location that will be available beginning October 11, 2022, or via USPS (no postage required).
- You may drop off your voted ballot at any designated Ballot Drop-off location or Vote Center in Riverside County before Election Day. Please visit www.voteinfo.net for a list of participating locations and hours, or you may call our office at the numbers listed.
- For your ballot to count, it must be in the possession of the Riverside County Registrar of Voters
 or an elections official at any Vote Center, Ballot Drop-off location, or Polling Place within the state
 by the close of polls on Election Day, November 8, 2022. Your ballot will also count if it is
 postmarked on or before Election Day and received no later than seven days after Election Day.

All Vote Centers, including the Registrar of Voters office, will be open on Election Day, November 8, from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Please feel free to contact the Riverside County Registrar of Voters at (951) 486-7200 with any questions or concerns regarding the upcoming November 8, 2022, Consolidated General Election.

Elections in California

The Top Two Candidates Open Primary Act requires that all candidates for a voter-nominated office be listed on the same ballot. Voter-nominated offices include state legislative offices, U.S. congressional offices, and state constitutional offices.

In both the open primary and general elections, you can vote for any candidate regardless of what party preference you indicated on your voter registration form. In the primary election, the two candidates receiving the most votes—regardless of party preference—move on to the general election. If a candidate receives a majority of the vote (at least 50 percent + 1), a general election still must be held.

California's open primary system does not apply to candidates running for U.S. President, county central committee, or local offices.

Write-in candidates for voter-nominated offices can still run in the primary election. However, a write-in candidate can only move on to the general election if the candidate is one of the top two vote-getters in the primary election. Additionally, there is no independent nomination process for a general election.

California law requires the following information to be printed in this guide.

Voter-Nominated Offices

Political parties are not entitled to formally nominate candidates for voter-nominated offices at the primary election. A candidate nominated for a voter-nominated office at the primary election is the nominee of the people and not the official nominee of any party at the general election. A candidate for nomination to a voter-nominated office shall have their qualified party preference, or lack of qualified party preference, stated on the ballot, but the party preference designation is selected solely by the candidate and is shown for the information of the voters only. It does not mean the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party designated, or that there is an affiliation between the party and candidate, and no candidate nominated by the voters shall be deemed to be the officially nominated candidate of any political party. In the county voter information guide, parties may list the candidates for voter-nominated offices who have received the party's official endorsement.

Any voter may vote for any candidate for a voter-nominated office, if they meet the other qualifications required to vote for that office. The top two vote-getters at the primary election move on to the general election for the voter-nominated office even if both candidates have specified the same party preference designation. No party is entitled to have a candidate with its party preference designation move on to the general election, unless the candidate is one of the two highest vote-getters at the primary election.

Nonpartisan Offices

Political parties are not entitled to nominate candidates for nonpartisan offices at the primary election, and a candidate at the primary election is not the official nominee of any party for the specific office at the general election. A candidate for nomination to a nonpartisan office may not designate their party preference, or lack of party preference, on the ballot. The top two vote-getters at the primary election move on to the general election for the nonpartisan office.

MEASURE "A" - CITY OF LA QUINTA

INITIATIVE ORDINANCE

TEXT OF INITIATIVE BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LA QUINTA, CALIFORNIA

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LA QUINTA, CALIFORNIA FIND AND DECLARE AS FOLLOWS: SECTIONS OF THE CITY OF LA QUINTA MUNICIPAL CODE SHALL BE AMENDED TO PHASE-OUT NON-HOSTED SHORT-TERM VACATION RENTALS IN NON-EXEMPT AREAS BY DECEMBER 31, 2024

WHEREAS, Chapter 3.25 of the La Quinta Municipal Code relates to short-term vacation rentals (STVRs); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority granted to the City of La Quinta ("City") by Article XI, Sections 5 and 7 of the California Constitution and the City Charter, the City has the police power to regulate the use of land, property and businesses within the City in a manner designed to promote public convenience and general prosperity, as well as public health, welfare, and safety; and

WHEREAS, the people of La Quinta have repeatedly expressed objections to their City Council regarding the proliferation and density of non-hosted STVRs in residential neighborhoods due to the negative impact on their quality of life, and the character and livability of their neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, the detrimental impacts of non-hosted STVRs on residential neighborhoods has not been adequately mitigated by the City Council resulting in ongoing interruption to residents' peaceful enjoyment of their homes and forcing residents to police continuous STVR issues such as excessive noise, disorderly conduct, overcrowding, traffic, parking, and trash; and

WHEREAS, STVRs are a commercial use of residential dwellings, generating income based on the short-term rental of residential dwellings akin to other commercial uses banned in residential neighborhoods, and the people of La Quinta have determined that the public nuisances created by non-hosted STVR commercial activities in residential neighborhoods is incompatible with surrounding residential uses; and

WHEREAS, the proliferation of non-hosted STVRs in residential neighborhoods has depleted the availability of housing for new homeowners and long-term tenants who contribute to the fabric of the community, spend their earnings locally, populate the school district, and operate local businesses or provide labor to local businesses; and

WHEREAS, this initiative phases out all types of non-hosted STVRs including general STVRs and primary residence STVRs, in all residential dwelling units in the City not exempted by the provisions of Section 3.25.055(A) below, by December 31, 2024, including residential dwelling units governed by homeowners' associations (HOAs) and covenants, conditions & restrictions (CC&Rs), but shall have no effect on hosted homeshare STVRs, vacation rentals exempted by the provisions of Section 3.25.055(A) below, or bed and breakfast operations; and

WHEREAS, the people of La Quinta acknowledge the importance of tourism to the La Quinta economy and call for the expansion of STVR units in exempt areas that meet the provisions of Section 3.25.055(A) below; and

WHEREAS, the people of La Quinta shall provide a phase-out period to minimize the economic impacts to existing non-hosted STVR permit holders but shall prohibit the issuance of any new non-hosted STVR permits in residential neighborhoods (not exempted by the provisions of Section 3.25.055(A) below) as of the effective date of this Initiative.

NOW THEREFORE, THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LA QUINTA DO HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

ITEM 1: Section 3.25.030 of the La Quinta Municipal Code shall be amended to add the following definition:

"Non-hosted short-term vacation rental" is a type of short-term vacation rental whereby the owner rents a short-term vacation rental unit (as defined herein), for compensation, for periods of thirty (30) consecutive calendar days or less, while the owner does not live on-site or in the dwelling unit, throughout the occupant's stay.

<u>ITEM 2</u>: Section 3.25.055 of the La Quinta Municipal Code shall be deleted in its entirety and the following shall be added in its place: 3.25.055 - non-issuance of new non-hosted short-term vacation rental permits and phase-out of existing non-hosted short-term vacation permits.

- A. Commencing on the effective date of this Initiative, there shall be no processing of, or issuance for, any applications for a new non-hosted short-term vacation rental permit, required by this chapter to use or operate a non-hosted short-term vacation rental unit in the city, except applications for a new non-hosted short-term vacation rental permit covering a non-hosted short-term vacation rental unit that meets one (1) or more of the following:
- 1. A residential dwelling within a residential project located in the CT Tourist Commercial District zone, as defined in Section 9.70.070 (or successor section) of this code and depicted in the city's official zoning map.
- 2. A residential dwelling within a residential project located in the VC Village Commercial District zone, as defined in Section 9.70.100 (or successor section) of this code and depicted in the city's official zoning map.
- 3. A residential dwelling within a residential project subject to a development agreement with the city, or subject to a condition of approval(s) attached to any entitlement approved by the city (including but not limited to a specific plan, subdivision map, or site development permit), pursuant to which non-hosted short-term vacation rentals are a permitted use, and the residential dwelling's use as a non-hosted short-term vacation rental is authorized under a declaration of covenants, conditions, and restrictions (CC&Rs), for the residential project.

- 4. A residential dwelling within the area covered by the SilverRock Resort Specific Plan.
- 5. A residential dwelling is located adjacent to the CT Tourist Commercial District zone, as defined in Section 9.70.070 and depicted in the city's official zoning map, and within the following boundaries; west of Avenida Obregon, south of the Avenida Fernando, east of Calle Mazatlan, and north of the driveway access between Calle Mazatlan and Avenida Obregon that serves as a southern boundary for the La Quinta Tennis Villas/ Tennis Condos area identified on page 25 of the La Quinta Resort Specific Plan, 121 E— Amendment 5 (as may be subsequently amended from time to time). For purposes of this subsection, "adjacent to" means across the street from or accessible by a driveway or service road designed to provide access to area(s) within the CT Tourist Commercial District zone.
- B. The city manager or authorized designee shall have the authority to implement policies or procedures to review and verify whether an application for a new short-term vacation rental permit meets the criteria set forth in this section.
- C. Until the expiration date of all non-hosted short-term vacation rental permits (not exempted by Section 3.25.055(A) above) in 2024 as defined below, this section shall not apply to applications for a renewal of an existing non-hosted short-term vacation rental permit and business license, submitted in compliance with this chapter, including when the short-term vacation rental permit is under suspension during the time for processing the renewal application. Applications for renewals must be submitted as prescribed by this chapter, and will be issued or denied based on the criteria pursuant to this chapter. Any short-term vacation rental unit, covered by a permit that is subject to an application for renewal, which is under temporary suspension in violation of this chapter or any other provisions of this code, shall not become permitted to use the dwelling as a short-term vacation rental unit until all violations that led to the temporary suspension have been remedied and the suspension has expired. Any revoked short-term vacation rental permit shall not be eligible for renewal or new short-term vacation rental permit.
- D. Commencing with the effective date of this Initiative, holders of non-hosted, valid short-term vacation rental permits shall continue to be eligible for renewal of their non-hosted short-term vacation rental permit however, all non-hosted short-term vacation rental permits, not exempted by Section 3.25.055(A) above, shall have an expiration date of December 31, 2024 or earlier. Beginning January 1, 2025, all permits for non-hosted short-term vacation rental units, not exempted by Section 3.25.055(A) above, shall be invalid.

Commencing January 1, 2025, there shall be no non-hosted short-term vacation rental permits issued or renewed to use or operate any privately owned residential dwelling (as defined in Section 3.25.030) as a non-hosted short-term vacation rental unit unless the unit meets one or more of the provisions of Section 3.25.055(A) above, or the unit holds a valid homeshare short-term vacation rental permit.

- **ITEM 3:** EFFECTIVE DATE. This initiate shall be adopted on the date the La Quinta City Council certifies the passage of this Initiative's ballot measure based on the election results and the effective date shall be ten (10) calendar days following that certification.
- **ITEM 4:** CONFORMING CODE PROVISIONS. Any provision of the La Quinta Municipal Code or appendices thereto inconsistent with the provisions of this Initiative, to the extent of such inconsistencies and no further, is hereby repealed or modified to that extent necessary to effect the provisions of this Initiative.
- ITEM 5: SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Initiative or resulting ballot measure is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, then such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Initiative or ballot measure. The People of the City of La Quinta hereby declare they would have voted for this ballot measure, and each section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion thereof be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE "A"

City of La Quinta

Ballot Measure proposing to phase-out and permanently ban "non-hosted short-term vacation rentals," as defined, in non-exempt areas of the City of La Quinta by December 31, 2024.

Measure "A" (Measure) was placed on the ballot by initiative petition and submitted to the electorate of the City of La Quinta (City).

Existing Law: In 2012, the La Quinta City Council (Council) enacted short-term vacation rental (STVR) regulations. Since then, Council has amended the regulations multiple times over the years.

Current City law defines "short-term vacation rental unit" to mean a privately owned residential dwelling, such as a single-family detached or multi-family attached unit, rented for occupancy for 30 consecutive calendar days or less. City law requires every owner of a dwelling used as a STVR to obtain a STVR permit, which is valid for one year and must be renewed annually. STVR permits are not transferrable upon sale of the dwelling. Owners holding STVR permits must remit to the City "transient occupancy taxes" (TOT) in the amount of 10% of the amount charged or chargeable to the person(s) occupying the STVR. As a "general tax," TOT revenue may be used to fund any and all City services, programs and projects.

Current City law bans the issuance of <u>new permits for STVRs in non-exempt</u> areas of the City, as defined, but allows <u>renewals</u> of permits annually if an owner of a dwelling had a valid STVR permit on or before August 4, 2020.

<u>Proposed Changes</u>: If the Measure is adopted, City law would be amended so that, by December 31, 2024, STVR permits would be prohibited, except in exempt areas of the City as specified in the Measure. If the Measure is adopted, <u>new</u> and <u>renewal</u> permits would be allowed only for residential dwellings where the owner *lives on-site* or *in the dwelling throughout the rental occupant's stay*, except in exempt areas as specified in the Measure.

Effect: STVRs are a significant share of the City's economy. According to independent economic consultants, in 2021, STVR visitor spending generated \$170 million in business sales, \$21.1 million in personal income, 779 jobs, and \$9.7 million in local tax revenues (primarily TOT and sales tax).

If the Measure is adopted, the inventory of available STVRs in the City would be reduced from approximately 1,200 to 400 units. The reduction in non-exempt areas would be significantly greater than the number of new registrations in exempt areas.

If the Measure is adopted, lower visitor spending in the City would result. According to independent economic consultants, there would be, annually, \$100 million less in business sales, 445 fewer jobs, \$13 million less in personal income, and between \$6.1 and \$8 million less in local tax revenues (primarily loss of TOT and sales tax).

A "Yes" vote is in favor of adopting the Measure's STVR phase-out and ban by December 31, 2024. A "No" vote is against the Measure's STVR phase-out and ban by December 31, 2024. If a simple majority of voters, voting on this Measure, vote "Yes," then this Measure will be approved and the implementing ordinance adopted.

ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE "A"

Measure A is about protecting our neighborhoods, our quality of life, our safety, and our homes. Who wants to live next to a Short-Term Vacation Rental (STVR)?

Cities across California, including 4 valley cities, have adopted ordinances like Measure A, successfully restoring residential neighborhoods without impacting their local economies. Most of La Quinta residential HOA communities already have a 30-day minimum rental regulation in place.

STVRs are disruptive to the character and fabric of La Quinta residential neighborhoods and are inconsistent with the land use intended for residential communities. STVRs expose our children and grandchildren to a revolving door of strangers creating problems which cannot be addressed with code enforcement. Drugs and alcohol-fueled parties destroy the peace, quiet and safety of our neighborhoods.

STVRs remove homes from an already limited housing inventory and the long-term rental market, preventing families from calling La Quinta home and denying their children the opportunity to attend our schools and increase our school funding.

Measure A is a common-sense solution to restrict STVRs to areas that are already designated for commercial tourism. This keeps Residential Neighborhoods for Residents, and Tourist Commercial areas for STVRs.

Measure A recognizes La Quinta as a tourist destination and supports tourism by stimulating the development of as many STVRs in designated Tourist Commercial areas as demand will support. Measure A will accelerate the SilverRock (Talus) development by removing competing rentals in residential neighborhoods.

Measure A defends La Quinta's heritage of having one of the highest percentage of family households in the valley. Don't let politicians, corporations, and out-of-town investors destroy your neighborhood, your quality of life, and your sense of safety by permitting short-term rentals in residential neighborhoods. La Quinta needs residential neighborhoods – VOTE YES on A.

REBUTTAL TO ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE "A"

There are no facts or data presented in arguments for Measure A.

Before voting, we must know and understand the facts, especially when the community will lose at least 445 full-time jobs, \$100 million in business sales, and \$8 million in local tax revenue if Measure A passes, impacting working families and small businesses the most.

The city needs to keep the financial resources and ability to control, enforce, and shut down UNFIT and UNPERMITTED operators. Hefty fines, enforcement, and attrition are getting the JOB DONE.

Measure A will NOT accelerate any development, including TALUS or new projects, as all projects require a willing developer, a suitable market, and an approval process before construction begins. Even with final approval, build-out can be 15 years or longer from first application to completion, depending on labor, materials, and costs for construction.

Measure A will NOT increase housing inventory. Only 139 out of 792 permitted STVRs homes are below \$600,000 and unlikely to be sold. The other 653 are valued between \$601,000 and \$4 million – well above what a \$75,000/year median income working-class families in La Quinta can afford. The path to affordability is through new affordable construction, which the city is actively pursuing.

No evidence exists that cities, where STVRs were banned have solved any issues or that STVR activities have ceased.

Passing Measure A will only ensure the PROLIFERATION OF UNPERMITTED OPERATORS.

We remain steadfast in recommending a NO VOTE on Measure A.

ARGUMENT AGAINST MEASURE "A"

A ban on new STVR permits in non-exempt residential areas has been in place since August 2020. The Municipal Code was amended (May 20, 2021) to formalize the permanent ban. This sensible approach has yielded an orderly reduction in STVRs. From January 2021 to June 2022, permits in non-exempt areas have declined from 1,037 to 792 or 23.63%, with a minimal economic impact on our community. In 2022, complaints decreased by 78% in Q-1 and 63% in Q-2 compared to the same 2021 periods.

While Measure A proponents are well-meaning individuals, this initiative is based on the unrealistic assumption that STVR issues can be addressed via an ON-OFF switch. Measure A will cause new problems. Placing an artificial deadline on a complex issue only provides the illusion of resolution. The reality of Measure A's unintended consequences will undoubtedly impact La Quinta's quality of life and economy. Consequences will include canceled or delayed public works projects, and lack of maintenance for our aging infrastructures, roads, parks, and amenities as Police-Fire is projected to consume most of Measure G revenue in the next few years.

STVR issues will not cease to exist by banning currently permitted operators. Why? The bulk of the problems (66% of all complaints during the festival season alone!) was generated by unpermitted operators. If Measure A passes, these folks will continue to operate, and more unpermitted operators will follow. The city will have insufficient financial resources to enforce the ban.

Although STVRs in non-exempt areas are already greatly reduced, STVRs generate \$6 million in annual TOT revenue for the city to provide essential services to all citizens; they also provide the resources to search, investigate, and eliminate unfit and unpermitted STVR operators.

VOTE NO and keep the PROVEN and EFFECTIVE method in place!

Same Day Voter Registration



Did you forget to register or update your voter registration? No Problem! You can register to vote and vote until 8:00 p.m. on Election Day at the Registrar of Voters office or at any Vote Center. This process is called Conditional Voter Registration (CVR) and is commonly referred to as Same Day Voter Registration. Here's how it works:

- 1. Visit the Registrar of Voters office or a Voter Center in Riverside County which can be found in the County Voter Information Guide or at voteinfo.net.
- 2. Complete a voter registration card or register online at RegisterToVote.ca.gov.
- 3. Vote your ballot.
- 4. Once the Registrar of Voters processes your registration, and determines you are eligible, you will be registered to vote and your ballot will be counted.

California Motor Voter



The California Motor Voter program is making registering to vote at the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) more convenient and secure. All eligible individuals completing driver's license or ID card or change of address transactions at the DMV will be registered to vote with the California Secretary of State unless they "opt out" of automatic voter registration.

The California Motor Voter program applies to Californians who are 18 years or older and meet the following criteria:

- A United States citizen and a resident of California.
- Not currently serving in a state or federal prison for the conviction of a felony.
- Not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court.

Note: Voter pre-registration is available for those 16 and 17 years of age. Their voter registration will become active automatically when they turn 18.

Before visiting a DMV field office, we recommend making an appointment. Visit https://www.dmv.ca.gov/portal/dmv/detail/portal/foa/welcome to get started. You can also use DMV online services (https://www.dmv.ca.gov/portal/dmv/dmv/onlinesvcs) to renew your driver's license or ID card or change your address.

If you indicate you're eligible to vote, once you complete your driver's license or state ID renewal form transaction online, by mail or in person at the DMV, your voter information is then transmitted securely and electronically to the California Secretary of State.

Please note that drivers with an AB 60 driver's license are not eligible to participate in the California Motor Voter program and are not eligible to vote.

Remote Accessible Vote-by-Mail (RAVBM) in Riverside County

For the November 8, 2022, Consolidated General Election, all voters will receive a ballot in the mail. Riverside County will begin mailing voters their ballots on October 11th.

You can also vote with Remote Accessible Vote-by-Mail. RAVBM lets you:

- Download, mark, and print your ballot at home
- Use your own assistive technology to read and mark the ballot
- Select the language for your ballot

RAVBM is not "internet voting." You must print and return your marked ballot.

Put your RAVBM ballot in the envelope you received in the mail. Sign the voter's declaration (punched holes tell you where to sign). Seal the envelope.

5. Return your ballot

By mail. (Your envelope will include pre-paid postage!)

YOU HAVE THE FOLLOWING RIGHTS:



The right to vote if you are a registered voter. You are eligible to vote if you are:

- a U.S. citizen living in California
- at least 18 years old
- · registered where you currently live
- not currently serving a state or federal prison term for the conviction of a felony, and
- not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court



The right to vote if you are a registered voter even if your name is not on the list. You will vote using a provisional ballot. Your vote will be counted if elections officials determine that you are eligible to vote.



The right to vote if you are still in line when the polls close.



The right to cast a secret ballot without anyone bothering you or telling you how to vote.



The right to get a new ballot if you have made a mistake, if you have not already cast your ballot. You can:

Ask an elections official at a polling place for a new ballot,

Exchange your vote-by-mail ballot for a new one at an elections office, or at your polling place, or

Vote using a provisional ballot.



The right to get help casting your ballot from anyone you choose, except from your employer or union representative.



The right to drop off your completed vote-by-mail ballot at any polling place in California.



The right to get election materials in a language other than English if enough people in your voting precinct speak that language.



The right to ask questions to elections officials about election procedures and watch the election process. If the person you ask cannot answer your questions, they must send you to the right person for an answer. If you are disruptive, they can stop answering you.



The right to report any illegal or fraudulent election activity to an elections official or the Secretary of State's office.

Tips for California's Military and Overseas Voters

Taking part in elections is more convenient than ever for Californians serving in the military or living outside the United States. It begins when you register to vote as a military or overseas voter and receive election materials by mail, fax, or email.

- Start early. California's county elections officials begin sending ballots to military and overseas voters 60 days before Election Day. Fill out a voter registration application early at RegisterToVote.ca.gov to ensure that you receive your voting materials in time.
- Know your options. When registering to vote as a military or overseas voter, you can choose to have your ballot mailed, faxed, or emailed to you. You may return your voted ballot to your county elections official by mail or, in certain circumstances, by fax. If you meet the requirements to return your ballot by fax, you must also fax the Oath of Voter form (available from your county elections official) waiving your right to a confidential ballot.
- Stay in touch. Once you register as a military or overseas voter, you will continue to receive a ballot and election materials from your county elections official before each election. We encourage you to update your registration each year, if needed; however, you must re-register to vote if you change your address, your name, or your political party preference, or if you do not participate in four consecutive statewide general elections. Visit www.sos.ca.gov/elections/voter-registration/ military-overseas-voters/ for more election resources designed especially for you.

Dates to remember:

October 24: last day to register to vote and request your ballot

November 1: last day to update or change how you want to receive your ballot

November 8: Election Day. Mailed ballots must be postmarked on or before Election Day **and** received by your county elections office no later than November 15. Faxed ballots must be delivered to your county elections office by close of polls, no later than 8:00 p.m. Pacific Standard Time, on Election Day.

ACCOMMODATIONS FOR VOTERS WITH DISABILITIES

All Vote Centers are accessible to voters who are physically disabled. Please be advised of the following alternate ways you may cast your ballot.

- By Mail Your ballot must be received at the Registrar of Voters office no later than 8:00 p.m. on Election Day or be postmarked on or before Election Day and received no later than seven days after Election Day to be counted. You may request a Vote-by-Mail ballot for all future Elections. Simply contact the Registrar of Voters office by calling (951) 486-7200, (800) 773-VOTE (8683), California Relay Service (Dial 711).
- Early Voting You may vote at the Registrar of Voters office October 11 November 7, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.; October 29 - October 30, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and November 5 - November 6, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.; and Election Day, November 8, 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Please visit our website at www.voteinfo.net for additional early voting locations and information.
- Remote Accessible Vote by Mail Ballot (RAVBM) Accessible Vote-by-Mail provides an accessible option for
 voters to mark their ballots privately and independently. To complete a RAVBM ballot visit www.voteinfo.net. Your
 completed ballot and signed Oath of the Voter must be returned to the Registrar of Voters office no later than 8:00
 p.m. on Election Day or be postmarked on or before Election Day and received no later than seven days after
 Election Day to be counted.
- Curbside Voting on Election Day If you are unable to enter the location due to a physical disability, you may
 request Curbside Voting at any Vote Center. Curbside Voting doorbells and signs are available at all Vote Centers.
 If you require Curbside Voting assistance you may call (877) 663-9906 before going to a Vote Center and/or when
 you arrive at the facility. An Election Officer will be contacted prior to your arrival to meet you at the curb.
