### Dear City of Riverside Voter:

On June 6, 2017, the City of Riverside is conducting an election for the purpose of electing members of the City Council for Wards 2, 4, and 6. All ballots will be cast by mail-in. There will be no polling places.

Postage-paid envelopes are provided for mailed ballot return. Ballots may also be dropped off on any day at the City Clerk's Office, City Hall, 7<sup>th</sup> Floor, 3900 Main Street or at the Registrar of Voters Office at 2724 Gateway Drive, Riverside.

For further voter convenience, ballot drop-off locations within the Wards will be open on Monday, June 5 and Tuesday, June 6, 2017. Please refer to the enclosed materials for sites and hours of operation. To be counted, ballots must be received by the Registrar of Voters by close of polls on Election Day or be postmarked on or before June 6, 2017, and received by the Registrar of Voters by June 9, 2017. *All voters are encouraged to return ballots early.* 

May 22, 2017, is the last day to register to be eligible to vote in this election.

## CITY OF RIVERSIDE MAIL BALLOT ELECTION JUNE 6, 2017



#### POLLING PLACES WILL NOT BE ESTABLISHED FOR THIS ELECTION.

The enclosed ballot is your **OFFICIAL BALLOT** for this election.

#### VOTING INSTRUCTIONS

Your voted ballot must be received at the Registrar of Voters Office or any drop-off location by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day or be postmarked on or before Election Day and received no later than three days after Election Day to be counted.


- 1. Use a black ball point pen. **DO NOT** use felt tip, red or gel ink.
  - a. To vote for a candidate whose name appears on the ballot, connect the head and tail of the arrow to the right of the name of the candidate for whom you wish to vote.
  - b. To vote for a qualified write-in candidate, print the candidate's name in the space provided below the candidates listed for the same office and connect the head and tail of the arrow to the right of the name you have written in. (*Important!* If you do not connect the arrow, your vote will not be counted.)
  - c. One line connecting the arrow is preferred. Vote for no more than the number of votes allowed in each contest (e.g. vote for one, vote for no more than two, etc.).
- 2. Remove the top stub and place the voted ballot card in the return envelope provided. Please keep the ballot folded the same way as you received it.
  - a. Sign your name and print your address where indicated. If you fail to sign the envelope your vote cannot be counted; and
  - b. Seal the envelope.
- 3. Return your ballot:
  - a. By mail:
    - A postage-paid envelope is provided to conveniently return your ballot by mail. Since this is a mail ballot election, there are no established polling places.
       Voters residing outside of the territorial limits of the United States must add postage appropriate for their current location.
  - b. In person to:
    - The Registrar of Voters office or the Riverside City Clerk's office during regular business hours and until 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. For your convenience the Registrar's office has a locked drop box at its entry for ballot drop off 24 hours a day; or
    - Designated ballot drop off locations listed below.
  - c. You may verify that the Registrar of Voters has received your voted ballot by checking the return status online at: www.voteinfo.net.

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION


- UNABLE TO RETURN YOUR BALLOT PERSONALLY? State law allows you to authorize any individual to return a voter's Vote-by-Mail ballot, as long as the authorized
  person does not receive any form of compensation for returning the Vote-by-Mail ballot. Your designated representative must complete the authorization statement on
  the enclosed return envelope.
- SPOILED YOUR BALLOT? Place the ballot card in the enclosed return envelope, place a check mark in the spoiled box on the return envelope and return it to our office. A new ballot will be sent to you if there is sufficient time to do so. If there is not sufficient time to return your ballot and receive another by mail, you may return your ballot personally to the Registrar of Voters office or call for further instructions at (951) 486-7200 or (800) 773-8683.
- ACCESSIBLE VOTING UNIT. An Accessible Voting Unit is available upon request at the Registrar of Voters office.

EDUCATION AND QUALIFICATIONS:

When I ran for City Council, I promised to be accessible and available to make a difference for the neighborhoods in Ward 6.

My 30 years as a police officer taught me that you don't solve problems sitting behind a desk. I spend the majority of my time in our neighborhoods — walking the streets, knocking on doors and making sure people get the help they need.

Together we've reduced graffiti 80%, from over 800 reports to under 150 monthly, resurfaced over 80 streets, redeveloped Camp Anza into housing for disabled veterans, and facilitated keeping Ralphs grocery store at La Sierra and Indiana. I've worked to create new jobs and expand the variety of retail and restaurants.

As part of my focus on children, I helped bring 20,000 pounds of fresh produce monthly to the Arlanza Kids Produce Market, partnered to donate over 300 pairs of running shoes, distributed over 300 computers to needy families and provided books for literacy programs.

# **Conditional Voter Registration**

Effective January 1, 2017, Conditional Voter Registration is available to eligible voters in California pursuant to Election Codes 2170 through 2173.

Conditional Voter Registration (CVR) extends the existing 15-day registration deadline to eligible voters, allowing them to register and vote 14 days prior to an election through Election Day. An eligible voter would need to register directly in the office of the Riverside County Registrar of Voters, located at 2724 Gateway Drive, in Riverside, CA 92507 to conditionally register to vote and vote a provisional ballot.

Voters may register online at www.registertovote.ca.gov, however, CVR ballots will only be issued at the office of the Registrar of Voters.

In order to conditionally register, the voter must first complete an affidavit of registration (also known as a Voter Registration Card). Once the registration is submitted, the Registrar of Voters will issue a CVR provisional ballot to vote.

The affidavit will be processed and once the eligibility is determined and validated, the registration will become permanent and the CVR provisional ballot will be counted.

Conditional Voter Registrations are treated and processed in the same manner as other registrations; CVR provisional ballots are treated and processed the same as other provisional ballots.

CVR was enacted in 2012, to be operative on January 1st after the certification of a statewide voter registration database. VoteCal, California's statewide voter registration database, was certified on September 26, 2016; CVR became operative as of January 1, 2017.
